CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Higher Education – College Admissions Outreach Program for High–Achieving Students – Establishment

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the College Admissions Outreach Program for 5 High-Achieving Students; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission 6 and the Maryland State Department of Education, in collaboration with certain 7 educational officials, agencies, and organizations, to jointly administer the Program; 8 requiring the Program to provide certain information on the college admissions 9 process to certain students free of charge, collaborate with a certain nonprofit entity 10 to identify certain students and to make certain students' contact information 11 available to certain institutions of higher education, develop and implement a certain system to provide certain institutions of higher education with access to a certain 12 13 student contact list, and establish a certain grant program; requiring the 14 Commission and the Department to adopt certain regulations; requiring the 15 Commission to submit a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; defining certain terms; and generally relating 16 17 to the College Admissions Outreach Program for High-Achieving Students.
