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Justice Reinvestment Coordinating Council

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Justice Reinvestment Coordinating Council in the 4 Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention; providing for the composition, $\mathbf{5}$ chair, and staffing of the Council; prohibiting a member of the Council from receiving 6 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; 7 establishing the duties of the Council; requiring the Council to report its interim and final findings and recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly on or 8 9 before certain dates; and generally relating to the Justice Reinvestment Coordinating Council. 10

14 (A) THE COUNCIL CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

15 (1) THREE MEMBERS OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY 16 THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;

17(2)THREE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY18THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;

19 (3) THE SECRETARY OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL 20 SERVICES, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

21(4)THE SECRETARY OF JUVENILE SERVICES, OR THE SECRETARY'S22DESIGNEE;

23 (5) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF MARYLAND, OR THE ATTORNEY 24 GENERAL'S DESIGNEE;

25 (6) THE PUBLIC DEFENDER OF MARYLAND, OR THE PUBLIC 26 DEFENDER'S DESIGNEE;

27(7) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND JUDICIARY, APPOINTED28BY THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE COURT OF APPEALS; AND

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1 (8) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE 2 DIRECTOR:

3(I) A REPRESENTATIVE OF LOCAL DETENTION CENTERS4RECOMMENDED BY THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES;

5 (II) A REPRESENTATIVE OF LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT 6 AGENCIES;

7 (III) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND STATE'S 8 ATTORNEYS ASSOCIATION; AND

9 (IV) ANY OTHER MEMBER WITH EXPERTISE RELEVANT TO THE 10 WORK OF THE COUNCIL.

11 (B) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL BE THE CHAIR OF THE COUNCIL.

12 (C) THE OFFICE SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COUNCIL.

13 (D) A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL:

14(1)MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE15COUNCIL; BUT

16 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 17 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS.

(1) USING A DATA-DRIVEN APPROACH, DEVELOP A STATEWIDE
POLICY FRAMEWORK TO REDUCE SPENDING ON CORRECTIONS AND REINVEST IN
STRATEGIES TO INCREASE PUBLIC SAFETY AND REDUCE RECIDIVISM; AND

(2) REQUEST TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE COUNCIL OF STATE
GOVERNMENTS JUSTICE CENTER AND THE PUBLIC SAFETY PERFORMANCE
PROJECT OF THE PEW CENTER ON THE STATES TO DEVELOP THE POLICY
FRAMEWORK.
