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### Department of Veterans Affairs - Employment Assistance for Veterans

3 FOR the purpose of expanding the responsibilities of service centers established by the 4 Department of Veterans Affairs; requiring the Department to provide veterans with 5 certain employment-related services for certain purposes; specifying the types of 6 employment-related services provided to veterans; requiring the Secretary of 7 Veterans Affairs to develop, in consultation with the Board of Trustees and the 8 Veterans Commission, a certain program to reduce unemployment among veterans 9 by assisting certain businesses to attract, hire, train, and retain certain veterans; 10 requiring that a certain program promote certain strategies for certain purposes; 11 specifying the contents of a certain program; authorizing certain employers to 12 advertise as a "Veteran Certified Company"; specifying the duration of a certain 13 certificate and authorizing the renewal of a certificate under certain circumstances; 14 and generally relating to the Department of Veterans Affairs and employment 15 assistance services and programs for veterans.
