A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study the Effect of the Drug Ritalin on School Children

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Effect of the Drug Ritalin on 4 School Children; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; 5 prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but 6 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to 7 study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task 8 Force to conduct certain public hearings; requiring the Task Force to report its 9 findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating 10 11 to the Task Force to Study the Effect of the Drug Ritalin on School Children.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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- 14 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Effect of the Drug Ritalin on School

- 17 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of

- designee;

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July

1, 2015. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 2017,
