Senate Bill 198

(Senator Nathan-Pulliam, *et al.*)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Health and Government Operations

Health Care Disparities, Cultural and Linguistic Competency, and Health
Literacy - Recommended Courses

This bill requires the Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities (MHHD) in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to provide specified health occupations boards with a list of recommended courses in cultural and linguistic competency, health disparities, and health literacy. Each board must (1) post the recommended courses on the board's website; (2) provide information about the courses to licensees at the time of licensure renewal; and (3) advertise the availability of the recommended courses in specified board publications.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: MHHD can develop a list of recommended courses, and the affected boards can post the courses on their websites, provide information, and publish the required advertising within existing budgeted resources. Revenues are not affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal for small businesses that offer such courses.

Current Law: In general, health occupations boards have continuing education requirements specific to their various disciplines. The health occupations boards require licensees to complete continuing education during the period preceding the expiration of the license. Health care professionals submit evidence of completion of required continuing education to the appropriate health occupations board according to regulations adopted by respective health occupations boards.

Additional Information

Prior Introductions: HB 1404 of 2014, a similar bill which would have required courses to be taken, was assigned to the House Rules Committee. No further action was taken on the bill.
