## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit Length to Visible area)

Taylor Avenue is one of only three north-south arterial roadways in the city, and is a key link in the overall circulation network. A transit route and entryway to the Navy Stadium used by numerous visitors to the city, Taylor Avenue links the heavily traveled Rowe Boulevard and West Street corridors. The project area is contiguous to the stretch of Taylor Avenue owned and maintained by the State as MD 435. The Poplar Trail terminates at Taylor Avenue adjacent to the Annapolis Police Station. The project will improve safety; construct curbs, gutters and sidewalks; and install a traffic signal at Poplar Trail. The severe reverse curve in Taylor Avenue near the Poplar Trail terminus will be flattened horizontally and vertically to provide a safer and smoother alignment.

Planning for this project was begun several years ago, and it is recommended in the City's Comprehensive Plan. Construction documents and right-of-way plats are prepared.
