On page 1, in line 3, strike "Prohibition on"; and strike beginning with "prohibiting" in line 4 down through "Directors;" in line 5 and substitute "<u>requiring a stay if a licensed funeral establishment notes an appeal from an order of summary suspension by the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors; authorizing a stay if a certain licensee notes an appeal from an order of summary suspension by the Board; requiring a court to provide notice of an opportunity to be heard to certain parties before staying a certain order; prohibiting a court from staying a certain order if, after a hearing, the court makes a certain finding;".</u>

"(3) (I) IF A LICENSEE THAT IS NOT A LICENSED FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT NOTES AN APPEAL FROM AN ORDER OF SUSPENSION OF A LICENSE MADE BY THE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 10-226(C)(2) OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE ORDER MAY BE STAYED.

(II) <u>BEFORE A COURT MAY STAY AN ORDER UNDER</u> <u>SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE COURT SHALL NOTIFY THE</u> <u>LICENSEE AND THE BOARD OF THE OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD.</u>

(III) <u>A COURT MAY NOT STAY AN ORDER ISSUED UNDER</u> SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH IF, AFTER A HEARING, THE COURT FINDS THAT THE VIOLATION BY THE LICENSEE PRESENTS A SUBSTANTIAL LIKELIHOOD OF RISK OF SERIOUS HARM TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE.".
