Unless another penalty specifically is provided elsewhere in this article, any person
found guilty of a second or subsequent violation of any provision of the same title, is subject
to a fine not exceeding \$1,000, or imprisonment not exceeding one year, or both, with costs
imposed in the discretion of the court. For the purposes of this section, a second or
subsequent violation is one which has occurred within two years of any prior violation of
this title and which arises out of a separate set of circumstances.
