## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Correctional Services - Senior Reentry Coordinating Council

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Senior Reentry Coordinating Council in the 4 Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services; providing for the 5 membership of the Council; providing that appointed members serve at the pleasure 6 of the Governor; providing for the term of an appointed member; providing for the 7 staggering of the terms of appointed members of the Council; providing that, at the 8 end of a term, an appointed member continues to serve until a successor is appointed 9 and qualifies; designating the chair of the Council; providing for the staff for the Council; prohibiting a member of the Council from receiving compensation; 10 11 authorizing a member of the Council to receive reimbursement for certain expenses; 12 providing for the duties of the Council; providing for the expiration of the terms of 13 certain members of the Council; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Senior Reentry Coordinating Council. 14

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- IN THIS SUBTITLE, "COUNCIL" MEANS THE SENIOR REENTRY COORDINATING 1 2 COUNCIL. 2-302. 3 THERE IS A SENIOR REENTRY COORDINATING COUNCIL IN THE 4 DEPARTMENT. 2-303. 6 7 THE COUNCIL CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS: (A) **(1)** THE SECRETARY, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE; 8 9 **(2)** THE SECRETARY OF AGING, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE; THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, OR THE 10 SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE; AND 11 12 **(4)** THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR: 13 (I)ONE MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WITH RELEVANT EXPERTISE 14 IN THE PROVISION OF REENTRY SERVICES TO ELDERLY OFFENDERS; 15 (II)ONE MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC REPRESENTING FAMILIES OF 16 **INCARCERATED INDIVIDUALS;** 17 (III) ONE INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS FORMERLY COMMITTED TO A STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY; AND 18 19 (IV) ONE MEMBER WITH EXPERTISE RELEVANT TO THE WORK OF 20THE COUNCIL. (B) 21**(1)** THE APPOINTED MEMBERS SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE 22GOVERNOR. 23 **(2)** THE TERM OF AN APPOINTED MEMBER IS 3 YEARS.
- 24 (3) THE TERMS OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS
  25 REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL
  26 ON OCTOBER 1, 2016.

1 AT THE END OF A TERM, AN APPOINTED MEMBER CONTINUES TO **(4)** 2 SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES. THE SECRETARY, OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE, SHALL: 3 (C) **(1)** CHAIR THE COUNCIL; AND 4 PROVIDE STAFF SUPPORT FOR THE COUNCIL FROM THE 5 **(2)** 6 DEPARTMENT. 7 (D) A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL: 8 **(1)** MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 9 COUNCIL; BUT 10 **(2)** IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET. 11 2-304.12 13 THE COUNCIL SHALL: IDENTIFY SERVICES NEEDED BY SENIORS WHO ARE BEING 14 **(1)** 15 RELEASED FROM PRISON; 16 **(2)** DETERMINE HOW THE SERVICES NEEDED BY SENIORS WHO ARE 17 BEING RELEASED FROM PRISON CAN BEST BE PROVIDED BY GOVERNMENTAL AND 18 OTHER ENTITIES; 19 **(3)** IDENTIFY PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT FAMILIES OF INCARCERATED 20INDIVIDUALS; 21**(4)** DEVELOP REENTRY POLICIES THAT INCORPORATE SUPPORT FOR 22 BOTH RETURNING INDIVIDUALS AND THEIR FAMILIES; AND ADVISE THE DEPARTMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH ITS WORK. 23 **(5)** SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial 24appointed members of the Council shall expire as follows: 25 26 one member in 2017; (1)
