2	within 6 months after the date on which the alleged discriminatory act occurred shall be
3	deemed to have complied with this subsection.

4 (d) The Commission, on its own motion, and by action of at least three 5 commissioners, may issue a complaint in its name in the same manner as if the complaint 6 had been filed by an individual, if:

7 (1) the Commission has received reliable information from an individual 8 that a person has been or is engaged in a discriminatory act; and

9 (2) after a preliminary investigation by the Commission's staff authorized 10 by the chair or vice-chair, the Commission is satisfied that the information warrants the 11 filing of a complaint.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to 13 apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or 14 application to any cause of action arising before the effective date of this Act.

15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 16 October 1, 2016.
