
Emergency Vehicles - Blood, Organ, or Tissue Delivery Vehicles

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the defined term "emergency vehicle" to include a blood, organ, 4 or tissue delivery vehicle; defining the term "blood, organ, or tissue delivery vehicle"; 5 authorizing the driver of an emergency vehicle to exercise certain privileges while 6 transporting under certain circumstances human blood, organs, or tissue or medical 7 personnel; authorizing blood, organ, or tissue delivery vehicles to be equipped with 8 certain light or signal devices; making certain conforming changes; making a certain 9 stylistic change; and generally relating to emergency blood, organ, or tissue delivery vehicles. 10

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That Section(s) 11–104.1 of Article – Transportation of the Annotated Code of Maryland be 3 renumbered to be Section(s) 11–104.2. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read 4 as follows: 5 6 **Article – Transportation** 7 11-104.1. "BLOOD, ORGAN, OR TISSUE DELIVERY VEHICLE" MEANS A VEHICLE THAT IS 8 USED AND MAINTAINED TO TRANSPORT HUMAN BLOOD, BLOOD PRODUCTS, ORGANS, 9 10 OR TISSUE ON AN EMERGENCY BASIS. 11 11-118.12 "Emergency vehicle" means any of the following vehicles that are designated by the Administration as entitled to the exemptions and privileges set forth in the Maryland 13 14 Vehicle Law for emergency vehicles: Vehicles of federal, State, or local law enforcement agencies; 15 (1) 16 (2)Vehicles of volunteer fire companies, rescue squads, fire departments, the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems, and the Maryland Fire 17 and Rescue Institute; 18 19 (3) State vehicles used in response to oil or hazardous materials spills; 20 State vehicles designated for emergency use by the Commissioner of **(4)** Correction; 2122 Ambulances; [and] (5)23**(6)** BLOOD, ORGAN, OR TISSUE DELIVERY VEHICLES; AND 24Special vehicles funded or provided by federal, State, or local government and used for emergency or rescue purposes in this State. 2516-104.1.

- 27 Except when the towing vehicle is a commercial motor vehicle and subject to the provisions of this section, a noncommercial Class A, B, or C license holder may: 28
- 29 (1) Tow any travel trailer as defined in § 11–170 of this article;



- 1 (3) Exceed any maximum speed limit, but only so long as the driver does 2 not endanger life or property;
- 3 (4) Disregard any traffic control device or regulation governing direction of 4 movement or turning in a specified direction; and
- 5 (5) Travel through any local jurisdiction in the State as necessary to 6 perform and return from motorcade or escort duty.
- 7 (c) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the privileges set forth in 8 this section apply only while the emergency vehicle is using audible and visual signals that 9 meet the requirements of § 22–218 of this article, except that an emergency vehicle 10 operated as a police vehicle need not be equipped with or display the visual signals.
- 11 (2) The privileges set forth in subsection (b)(1) of this section apply only 12 while the emergency vehicle is using visual signals that meet the requirements of § 22–218 13 of this article.
- 14 (3) (i) The driver of an emergency vehicle may not use flashing lights 15 or a bell, siren, or exhaust whistle while returning from an emergency call, fire alarm, or 16 motorcade or escort, except that fire apparatus carrying standing firemen may use flashing 17 lights that are visible only to the rear.
- 18 (ii) The driver of an emergency vehicle, while parking or backing the 19 emergency vehicle, may use flashing lights within 100 feet of the entrance ramp to a:
- 20 1. Fire station; or
- 21 2. Rescue station.
 - (4) Before exercising the privileges set forth in subsection (b)(5) of this section, the jurisdiction that employs the driver of a motorcade or escort shall provide notice of the motorcade or escort to any jurisdiction that the driver will enter while performing or returning from the motorcade or escort duty.
- 26 (d) This section does not relieve the driver of an emergency vehicle from the duty 27 to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons.

(c) (1) A person may not drive or move on any highway any vehicle or equipment that is equipped with or displays any light or signal device designed to emit an oscillating, rotating, blinking, or other type of emission of light, unless designated and authorized by the Administrator as indicated in paragraphs (2) through [(12)] (13) of this subsection. The provisions of this section do not prohibit the display and use of any lighting device that may be permitted or required elsewhere in the Maryland Vehicle Law.

- 1 (4) Ambulances may be equipped with or display red [and/or], white, OR 2 RED AND WHITE lights or signal devices.
- 3 (13) Blood, organ, or tissue delivery vehicles may be 4 Equipped with or display red, white, or red and white lights or signal 5 devices.
- 6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2016.
