| 15 16 | SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: |

| 19 20 | (k) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the court shall issue a new final protective order against an individual if: |

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- order, the individual was convicted and sentenced to serve a term of imprisonment of at least 5 years, INCLUDING ANY PERIOD OF PROBATION OR PORTION OF THE SENTENCE SUSPENDED, under § 2–205, § 2–206, § 3–202, § 3–203, § 3–304, § 3–305, § 3–306, § 3–309, § 3–310, § 3–311, or § 3–312 of the Criminal Law Article or for conspiracy or solicitation to commit murder and the individual has served at least 12 months of the sentence; and

- 10 (2) In a final protective order issued under this subsection, the court may 11 grant only the relief that was granted in the original protective order under subsection 12 (d)(1) or (2) of this section.
- 13 (3) Unless terminated at the request of the victim, a final protective order 14 issued under this subsection shall be permanent.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
