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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Montgomery County Board of Education – Elections – Voting by County**  
3 **Residents**

4 **MC 25–16**

5 FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to provide that  
6 the Montgomery County Council may, by law, establish qualifications for voting by  
7 residents of the county in an election for the elected members of the Montgomery  
8 County Board of Education, provided that the qualifications may not be more  
9 restrictive than the qualifications for voting established by the Maryland  
10 Constitution or by State law; altering provisions of law regarding voter registration  
11 and voting by residents of Montgomery County in elections for the elected members  
12 of the Montgomery County Board of Education; requiring the Montgomery County  
13 Board of Elections to establish procedures, in accordance with qualifications  
14 established by law by the Montgomery County Council, to allow residents of the  
15 county to vote in any election for the elected members of the Montgomery County  
16 Board of Education; providing for the effective date of certain provisions of this Act;  
17 generally relating to voting by residents of Montgomery County in Montgomery  
18 County Board of Education elections; and submitting this amendment to the  
19 qualified voters of the State for their adoption or rejection.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
 15 (Three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses concurring), That it be  
 16 proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

17 **Article I – Elective Franchise**

18 1.

19 All elections shall be by ballot. Except as provided in [Section 3] **SECTIONS 3 AND**  
 20 **3A** of this article, every citizen of the United States, of the age of 18 years or upwards, who  
 21 is a resident of the State as of the time for the closing of registration next preceding the  
 22 election, shall be entitled to vote in the ward or election district in which the citizen resides  
 23 at all elections to be held in this State. A person once entitled to vote in any election district,  
 24 shall be entitled to vote there until the person shall have acquired a residence in another  
 25 election district or ward in this State.

27 **IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY COUNCIL MAY, BY**  
 28 **LAW, ESTABLISH QUALIFICATIONS FOR VOTING BY RESIDENTS OF THE COUNTY IN**  
 29 **ANY ELECTION FOR THE ELECTED MEMBERS OF THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY**  
 30 **BOARD OF EDUCATION, PROVIDED THAT THE QUALIFICATIONS MAY NOT BE MORE**  
 31 **RESTRICTIVE THAN THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR VOTING ESTABLISHED BY THIS**  
 32 **CONSTITUTION OR BY STATE LAW.**

33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read  
 34 as follows:

35 **Article – Education**

1 3-901.

2 (b) The Montgomery County Board consists of:

3 (1) 5 elected members, each of whom resides in a different board of  
4 education district;

5 (2) 2 elected members who may reside anywhere in the county; and

6 (3) 1 student member.

7 (c) An elected member of the county board shall be a registered voter of  
8 Montgomery County.

9 (f) (2) (I) Elected members of the county board shall be elected by the  
10 voters of the entire county.

11 (II) **A RESIDENT OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY WHO REGISTERS**  
12 **TO VOTE IN ACCORDANCE WITH QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED BY LAW BY THE**  
13 **MONTGOMERY COUNTY COUNCIL AND WITH PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY THE**  
14 **MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS UNDER § 3-102 OF THE ELECTION**  
15 **LAW ARTICLE MAY VOTE IN AN ELECTION FOR THE ELECTED MEMBERS OF THE**  
16 **MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD.**

17 **Article – Election Law**

18 3-102.

19 (a) (1) Except as provided in [subsection (b)] **SUBSECTIONS (B) AND (C)** of  
20 this section, an individual may become registered to vote if the individual:

21 (i) is a citizen of the United States;

22 (ii) is at least 16 years old;

23 (iii) is a resident of the State as of the day the individual seeks to  
24 register; and

25 (iv) registers pursuant to this title.

26 (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1)(ii) of this subsection, an individual  
27 under the age of 18 years:

28 (i) may vote in a primary election in which candidates are  
29 nominated for a general or special election that will occur when the individual is at least  
30 18 years old; and

1 (ii) may not vote in any other election.

2 **(B) IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH**  
3 **PROCEDURES TO ALLOW RESIDENTS OF THE COUNTY WHO SATISFY**  
4 **QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED BY LAW BY THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY COUNCIL**  
5 **TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN ANY ELECTION FOR THE ELECTED MEMBERS OF THE**  
6 **MONTGOMERY COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION WHO ARE ELECTED UNDER § 3-901**  
7 **OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE.**

8 **[(b)] (C)** An individual is not qualified to be a registered voter if the individual:

9 (1) has been convicted of a felony and is actually serving a court-ordered  
10 sentence of imprisonment, including any term of parole or probation, for the conviction;

11 (2) is under guardianship for mental disability and a court of competent  
12 jurisdiction has specifically found by clear and convincing evidence that the individual  
13 cannot communicate, with or without accommodations, a desire to participate in the voting  
14 process; or

15 (3) has been convicted of buying or selling votes.

17 (a) Under the supervision of the State Board, and in accordance with regulations  
18 and procedures adopted by the State Board, a local board shall conduct all elections held  
19 under this article in the county in which the board is located.

20 (b) Except where it would be inappropriate, or as otherwise provided in this  
21 article, the electoral process for primary elections, general elections, and special elections  
22 shall be uniform.

23 **(C) IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH**  
24 **PROCEDURES TO ALLOW RESIDENTS OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY WHO SATISFY**  
25 **QUALIFICATIONS ESTABLISHED BY LAW BY THE MONTGOMERY COUNTY COUNCIL**  
26 **TO VOTE IN ANY ELECTION FOR THE ELECTED MEMBERS OF THE MONTGOMERY**  
27 **COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION WHO ARE ELECTED UNDER § 3-901 OF THE**  
28 **EDUCATION ARTICLE.**

29 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly  
30 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by Section 1 of this  
31 Act affects only one county and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland  
32 Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments apply.

33 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the amendment to the  
34 Maryland Constitution proposed by Section 1 of this Act shall be submitted to the qualified

1 voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November 2016 for their  
2 adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general  
3 election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and  
4 upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and  
5 "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. Immediately after the  
6 election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the proposed  
7 amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further  
8 proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.

9 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take  
10 effect October 1, 2019, on the taking effect of Section 1 of this Act. If Section 1 of this Act  
11 does not take effect, Section 2 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and  
12 effect.

13 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in  
14 Sections 3, 4, and 5 of this Act, this Act shall take effect June 1, 2016.
