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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Board of Physicians – License Renewal – Grace Periods**

3 FOR the purpose of clarifying the license renewal process for licensed physicians; providing  
4 that certain licensed physicians and allied health professionals regulated by the  
5 State Board of Physicians have a certain grace period, under certain circumstances,  
6 to renew a license retroactively; providing that, after a certain grace period has  
7 ended, certain licenses lapse into a nonrenewal status; authorizing the Board to  
8 require certain former licensees to meet certain requirements to be reinstated after  
9 a certain grace period has ended; and generally relating to license renewal by the  
10 State Board of Physicians.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Health Occupations**

20 14–316.

21 (a) (1) The Board shall provide for the term and renewal of licenses under this  
22 section.

23 (2) The term of a license may not be more than 3 years.

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EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.  
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (3) A license expires at the end of its term, unless the license is renewed  
2 for [a] **AN ADDITIONAL** term as provided [by the Board] **IN THIS SECTION**.

3 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, at least 1 month before the  
4 license expires, the Board shall send to the licensee, by electronic or first-class mail to the  
5 last known electronic or physical address of the licensee:

6 (i) A renewal notice that states:

7 1. The date on which the current license expires;

8 2. The date by which the renewal application must be  
9 received by the Board for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the license expires;  
10 and

11 3. The amount of the renewal fee; and

12 (ii) A blank panel data sheet supplied by the Health Care  
13 Alternative Dispute Resolution Office.

14 (2) If the Board chooses to send renewal notices exclusively by electronic  
15 mail under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the Board shall send a renewal notice by  
16 first-class mail to a licensee on request of the licensee.

17 (c) Before the license expires, the licensee periodically may renew it for an  
18 additional term, if the licensee:

19 (1) Otherwise is entitled to be licensed;

20 (2) Pays to the Board a renewal fee set by the Board; and

21 (3) Submits to the Board:

22 (i) A renewal application on the form that the Board requires; and

23 (ii) Satisfactory evidence of compliance with any continuing  
24 education requirements set under this section for license renewal.

25 (d) (1) In addition to any other qualifications and requirements established by  
26 the Board, the Board may establish continuing education requirements as a condition to  
27 the renewal of licenses under this section.

28 (2) In establishing these requirements, the Board shall evaluate existing  
29 methods, devices, and programs in use among the various medical specialties and other  
30 recognized medical groups.

1 (3) The Board shall adopt regulations that allow a licensee seeking renewal  
2 to receive up to 5 continuing education credits per renewal period for providing  
3 uncompensated, voluntary medical services during each renewal period.

4 (4) The Board may not establish or enforce these requirements if they  
5 would so reduce the number of physicians in a community as to jeopardize the availability  
6 of adequate medical care in that community.

7 (5) The Board may impose a civil penalty of up to \$100 per continuing  
8 medical education credit in lieu of a sanction under § 14–404 of this title, for a first offense,  
9 for the failure of a licensee to obtain the continuing medical education credits required by  
10 the Board.

11 (e) The Board shall renew the license of each licensee who meets the  
12 requirements of this section.

13 **(F) (1) A LICENSEE HAS A GRACE PERIOD OF 60 DAYS AFTER A LICENSE**  
14 **EXPIRES IN WHICH TO RENEW IT RETROACTIVELY IF THE LICENSEE:**

15 **(I) OTHERWISE MEETS THE RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS OF THIS**  
16 **SECTION; AND**

17 **(II) PAYS TO THE BOARD THE RENEWAL FEE AND ANY LATE FEE**  
18 **SET BY THE BOARD.**

19 **(2) AFTER THE GRACE PERIOD OF 60 DAYS:**

20 **(I) THE EXPIRED LICENSE LAPSES INTO A NONRENEWAL**  
21 **STATUS; AND**

22 **(II) THE BOARD MAY REQUIRE THE FORMER LICENSEE TO MEET**  
23 **THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 14–317 OF THIS SUBTITLE TO BE REINSTATED.**

24 **[(f)] (G) (1)** Each licensee shall notify the secretary of the Board in writing of  
25 any change in the licensee's name or address within 60 days after the change.

26 (2) If a licensee fails to notify the secretary of the Board within the time  
27 required under this section, the licensee is subject to an administrative penalty of \$100.

28 **[(g)] (H) (1)** Beginning October 1, 2016, the Board shall require a criminal  
29 history records check in accordance with § 14–308.1 of this subtitle for:

30 (i) Annual renewal applicants as determined by regulations  
31 adopted by the Board; and

1 (ii) Each former licensee who files for reinstatement under § 14–317  
2 of this subtitle after failing to renew the license for a period of 1 year or more.

3 (2) On receipt of the criminal history record information of a licensee  
4 forwarded to the Board in accordance with § 14–308.1 of this subtitle, in determining  
5 whether to renew or reinstate a license, the Board shall consider:

6 (i) The age at which the crime was committed;

7 (ii) The nature of the crime;

8 (iii) The circumstances surrounding the crime;

9 (iv) The length of time that has passed since the crime;

10 (v) Subsequent work history;

11 (vi) Employment and character references; and

12 (vii) Other evidence that demonstrates whether the licensee poses a  
13 threat to the public health or safety.

14 (3) The Board may not renew or reinstate a license if the criminal history  
15 record information required under § 14–308.1 of this subtitle has not been received.

17 (a) A license expires on a date set by the Board, unless the license is renewed for  
18 an additional term as provided in this section.

14 (2) A license may not be renewed for a term longer than 2 years.

28 (a) A license expires on a date set by the Board, unless the license is renewed for  
29 an additional term as provided in this section.

1 (b) At least 1 month before the license expires, the Board shall send to the licensee  
2 a renewal notice that states:

3 (1) The date on which the current license expires;

4 (2) The date by which the renewal application must be received by the  
5 Board for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the license expires; and

6 (3) The amount of the renewal fee.

7 (c) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, before a license expires, the  
8 licensed individual may periodically renew it for an additional term, if the individual:

9 (1) Pays to the Board a renewal fee set by the Board;

12 (ii) Satisfactory evidence of compliance with any continuing  
13 education or competency requirements and other requirements required by the Board for  
14 license renewal; and

15 (3) Meets any additional renewal requirements established by the Board.

16 (d) (1) In addition to any other qualifications and requirements established by  
17 the Board, the Board may establish continuing education or competency requirements as a  
18 condition to the renewal of licenses under this section.

19 (2) The Board may impose a civil penalty of up to \$100 per continuing  
20 medical education credit in lieu of a sanction under § 14-5B-14 of this subtitle, for a first  
21 offense, for the failure of a licensee to obtain the continuing medical education credits  
22 required by the Board.

23 (e) (1) The Board shall renew the license of each individual who meets the  
24 renewal requirements of this section.

25 (2) A license may not be renewed for a term longer than 2 years.

1 (3) The amount of the renewal fee; and

2 (4) For licensees who qualified for an initial license under § 14–5E–09(c)(2)  
3 of this subtitle, that the licensee must submit satisfactory evidence of a passing score on  
4 the examination as required under subsection (c)(2) of this section.

5 (c) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, before a license expires,  
6 the licensed perfusionist periodically may renew it for an additional term, if the licensee:

7 (i) Otherwise is entitled to be licensed;

8 (ii) Pays to the Board a renewal fee set by the Board; and

9 (iii) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, submits  
10 to the Board:

11 1. A renewal application on the form that the Board requires;  
12 and

13 2. Satisfactory evidence of compliance with any continuing  
14 education or competency requirements and other requirements set under this section for  
15 license renewal.

16 (2) A licensee who qualified for an initial license under § 14–5E–09(c)(2) of  
17 this subtitle shall submit to the Board satisfactory evidence of a passing score on the  
18 national certifying examination given by the American Board of Cardiovascular Perfusion  
19 or its successor organization or another examination given or approved by the Board.

20 (d) In addition to any other qualifications and requirements established by the  
21 Board, the Board shall establish continuing education or competency requirements as a  
22 condition of the renewal of a license under this section.
