15 16 17	(a) (1) The Department annually may issue a complimentary [hunter's] HUNTING license to the President of the United States, the governor of any state, or an official or an enforcement officer of the game and fish management agency of another state which reciprocally offers complimentary hunting licenses.
19 20 21	(2) (i) The Department may issue a lifetime complimentary [hunter's] <b>HUNTING</b> license to a Maryland resident who certifies that the resident is a former prisoner of war or 100% service connected disabled American veteran.
22 23 24 25 26	(ii) The Department may issue a lifetime complimentary [hunter's] <b>HUNTING</b> license to an out–of–state person who certifies that the person is a former prisoner of war or a 100% service connected disabled American veteran if the person's state of residence extends similar privileges to former prisoners of war or 100% service connected disabled American veterans of this State.

- 9 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 10 (d) Except as otherwise provided in §§ 9–906 and 9–907 of this subtitle, "veteran" 11 means an individual who served on active duty in the armed forces of the United States, 12 other than for training, and was discharged or released under conditions other than 13 dishonorable.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2016.
