
- FOR the purpose of providing that the Police Training Commission has the duty to require 3 4 that entrance-level and in-service training for law enforcement officers include
- 5 certain community service requirements; providing that the Commission develop a
- list of certain organizations for which community service may be provided; and 6

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13
- That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14
- Article Public Safety 15
- 3-207.16

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- 17 Subject to the authority of the Secretary, the Commission has the following powers 18 and duties:
- 19 to establish standards for the approval and continuation of approval of 20 schools that conduct police entrance—level and in—service training courses required by the
- 21Commission, including State, regional, county, and municipal training schools;
- 22 (2)to approve and issue certificates of approval to police training schools;
- 23 (3)to inspect police training schools;





- 1 to make a continuous study of entrance-level and in-service training (10)2 methods and procedures: 3 to consult with and accept the cooperation of any recognized federal, 4 State, or municipal law enforcement agency or educational institution; 5 to consult and cooperate with universities, colleges, and institutions in 6 the State to develop specialized courses of study for police officers in police science and 7 police administration; 8 to consult and cooperate with other agencies and units of the State 9 concerned with police training; 10 to develop, with the cooperation of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, a uniform missing person report form 11 to be available for use by each law enforcement agency of the State on or before October 1, 12 13 2008; 14 (15) to require, for entrance-level police training and annually for 15 in-service level police training conducted by the State and each county and municipal police training school, that the curriculum and minimum courses of study include, for police 16 17 officers who are issued an electronic control device by a law enforcement agency, special training in the proper use of electronic control devices, as defined in § 4–109 of the Criminal 18 19 Law Article, consistent with established law enforcement standards and federal and State 20 constitutional provisions; 21to require, for entrance-level police training and, as determined by the 22Commission, for in-service level training conducted by the State and each county and 23municipal police training school, that the curriculum and minimum courses of study 24include, consistent with established law enforcement standards and federal and State 25constitutional provisions: 26 training in lifesaving techniques, including Cardiopulmonary (i) 27Resuscitation (CPR); 28(ii) training in the proper level and use of force; 29 training regarding sensitivity to cultural and gender diversity; (iii) 30 and
- 31 (iv) training regarding individuals with physical, intellectual, 32 developmental, and psychiatric disabilities;
- 33 (17) to develop, with the cooperation of the Office of the Attorney General, 34 the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention, and the Federal Trade Commission, 35 a uniform identity fraud reporting form that:

 6 ANNUALLY FOR IN-SERVICE LEVEL POLICE TRAINING CONDUCTED BY THE STATE
 7 AND EACH COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL, THAT THE
 8 CURRICULUM INCLUDE AT LEAST 40 HOURS OF COMMUNITY SERVICE; AND
- 9 (II) TO DEVELOP A LIST OF COMMUNITY AND NONPROFIT 10 ORGANIZATIONS, INCLUDING LOCAL PUBLIC SCHOOLS, ASSISTED LIVING OR 11 CONTINUING CARE FACILITIES, OR LOCAL YOUTH SPORTS ORGANIZATIONS, FOR 12 WHICH REQUIRED COMMUNITY SERVICE MAY BE PROVIDED; AND
- 13 **(19)** to perform any other act that is necessary or appropriate to carry out 14 the powers and duties of the Commission under this subtitle.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
