- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, SHALL:
- 3 (1) SUPPORT AND FACILITATE EDUCATION IN COMPUTER HEALTH 4 AND SAFETY GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES IN EVERY COUNTY;
- 5 (2) DEVELOP A PROCESS TO MONITOR IMPLEMENTATION OF 6 EDUCATION IN COMPUTER HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES; 7 AND
- (3) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2020, AND EVERY 5 YEARS THEREAFTER, SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY A SUMMARY OF THE INFORMATION REPORTED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT DURING THE CERTIFICATION OF THE HEALTH EDUCATION STATE CURRICULUM.

- 14 (a) The State Board shall encourage the county boards to incorporate age—appropriate lessons on dating violence, diabetes and its treatment and prevention, oral disease prevention, [and] dental health promotion, AND COMPUTER HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES into the county boards' health education curriculum.
- 19 (b) On or before December 1, 2015, and every 5 years thereafter, the Department 20 shall report to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to 21 the General Assembly a summary of the information reported to the State Superintendent 22 during the COMAR certification process.
