A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **University of Maryland Strategic Partnership Act of 2016**

3 FOR the purpose of creating a strategic partnership between certain higher education
4 institutions to be called the University of Maryland; requiring each campus of the
5 University of Maryland to have a president subject to a decision by the Board of
6 Regents at a certain time; requiring the presidents to jointly operate and manage
7 the University of Maryland; stating certain findings of the General Assembly;
8 requiring the presidents to develop and implement a certain plan; requiring the
9 presidents of certain campuses to perform certain duties; establishing a University
10 of Maryland Joint Steering Council with a certain membership; requiring the
11 Council to perform certain duties; establishing a Center for Maryland Advanced
12 Ventures; requiring the Center to be located in Baltimore City; requiring the Center
13 to perform certain duties; requiring the Center to provide certain services to certain
14 institutions; authorizing the Center to assess a certain fee for certain services;
15 requiring the presidents to appoint an Executive Director of the Center; requiring
16 the Executive Director of the Center to perform certain duties; authorizing the
17 Maryland Technology Development Corporation to advise the Executive Director on
18 the development of the Center; requiring the Governor to appropriate at least certain
19 amounts to support the Center in certain fiscal years; establishing a University of
20 Maryland Center for Economic and Entrepreneurship Development (UMCEED);
21 requiring UMCEED to be located on a certain campus; requiring UMCEED to
22 perform certain duties; requiring the presidents to appoint an Executive Director of
23 UMCEED; requiring the Executive Director of UMCEED to perform certain duties;
24 requiring the Governor to appropriate at least a certain amount to support UMCEED
25 beginning in a certain fiscal year; repealing the requirement that certain institutions
26 be considered a single institution for certain purposes; requiring the Consolidated
27 Transportation Program to include certain information; requiring the University
28 System of Maryland to locate a certain office in Baltimore City by a certain date;
29 requiring ownership of a certain property to be transferred to the University of
30 Maryland, College Park Campus by a certain date; requiring the submission of
31 certain legislation if a certain decision is made by the Board of Regents; requiring

1 the presidents of certain campuses to jointly develop certain plans; requiring the
 2 Governor to include a certain amount in a certain budget to construct a certain
 3 facility at the Universities of Shady Grove; requiring the Chancellor of the
 4 University System of Maryland to make a certain evaluation and recommendation
 5 by a certain date; providing that the University of Maryland Joint Steering
 6 Committee is the successor to a certain MPowering the State Steering Committee;
 7 providing that the University of Maryland is the successor of the University of
 8 Maryland, College Park and the University of Maryland, Baltimore; providing that
 9 certain names and titles of a certain unit and officials in laws and other documents
 10 mean the names and titles of the successor unit and officials; providing for the
 11 continuity of certain matters and persons; requiring the publisher of the Annotated
 12 Code, in consultation with, and subject to the approval of, the Department of
 13 Legislative Services, to make certain corrections; defining certain terms; repealing a

27 Preamble

28 WHEREAS, The University of Maryland, College Park is the State’s flagship public
29 higher education institution. It has major undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral programs
30 with a significant research component generating almost \$500 million in 2013; and

31 WHEREAS, The University of Maryland, Baltimore has seven professional and
32 graduate schools, including the only public school of medicine in the State, which train the
33 majority of the State’s physicians, nurses, dentists, lawyers, social workers, and
34 pharmacists; and

35 WHEREAS, There are almost no flagship research institutions the caliber of the
36 University of Maryland, College Park or professional schools the caliber of the University
37 of Maryland, Baltimore in the United States that do not have a connection between the
38 flagship research institution and the medical school and law school; and

1 WHEREAS, All but one of the funding peers for the University of Maryland, College
2 Park have a school of medicine, law, or both at the same institution and all of the “Big 10”
3 institutions have both a school of medicine and a law school; and

4 WHEREAS, All of the funding peers for the University of Maryland, Baltimore are
5 also research institutions; and

6 WHEREAS, The courses of study and degrees offered at the University of Maryland,
7 College Park and the University of Maryland, Baltimore are complementary and largely
8 unduplicated; and

9 WHEREAS, The national research rankings under a unified University of Maryland
10 would dramatically improve creating greater opportunities for research in the State; and

11 WHEREAS, The total research expenditure ranking for the University of Maryland,
12 College Park increases from 41st and the University of Maryland, Baltimore increases from
13 48th in the country to a ranking of 12th in the nation and 8th for a public institution,
14 exceeding the ranking of institutions such as the Massachusetts Institute of Technology;
15 and

16 WHEREAS, Federal research rankings increase from 31st in the country for the
17 University of Maryland, College Park and 54th for the University of Maryland, Baltimore
18 to 11th in the country, placing the unified institution ahead of institutions such as the
19 Pennsylvania State University, the University of Virginia, and the University of California,
20 Berkeley; and

21 WHEREAS, With both a unified University of Maryland and Johns Hopkins
22 University located in Baltimore City, the City will be one of the only cities in the nation
23 with two top-ranked research institutions within its borders; and

24 WHEREAS, Under the “MPower” initiative, joint research awards totaled almost
25 \$79 million over a 3-year period, an increase of 60%; and

26 WHEREAS, Technology transfer is a major and measurable economic impact of
27 higher education in the State and through “MPower” and UM Ventures technology transfer
28 has increased by 100% over 5 years with licensing revenue increasing 72% over the same
29 period; and

30 WHEREAS, The success of joint efforts through the “MPower” initiative
31 demonstrates the potential of a reunified major public research institution with the public
32 professional schools in Maryland; and

33 WHEREAS, As the State continues slowly moving out of a national recession
34 combined with federal government contraction, the State must take the steps necessary to
35 position itself to be as competitive as possible in the economy of the future; and

1 WHEREAS, The State must plan now for what we know will create the technology
2 and research jobs that will power our economy and ensure that Maryland is the place to go
3 for state-of-the-art research, to take that research and spin it off into the marketplace,
4 and to successfully build a company and create jobs based on the education and research
5 opportunities in this State; now, therefore,

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
7 That Section(s) 2-103.1(c)(3) through 2-103.1(c)(7), respectively, of Article
8 – Transportation of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s)
9 2-103.1(c)(4) through 2-103.1(c)(8), respectively.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read
11 as follows:

12 Article – Education

13 4-402.

14 (d) (1) The Chief Executive Officer shall enter into a memorandum of
15 understanding that relates to the provision of policy analysis and advice to the county board
16 with the following institutions of higher education:

17 (i) The University of Maryland, College Park **CAMPUS**;

18 10-209.

19 (d) (1) The Board of Regents of the University System of Maryland shall
20 appoint a Chancellor who shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the University System of
21 Maryland and the Chief of Staff for the Board. The Chancellor and the staff of the Board
22 shall serve as coordinators and system planners for the University **SYSTEM OF**
23 **MARYLAND**.

24 (2) The Chancellor shall:

25 (i) Advise the Board of Regents on systemwide policy;

26 (ii) Conduct systemwide planning;

27 (iii) Coordinate and arbitrate among the institutions and centers of
28 the University **SYSTEM OF MARYLAND**;

29 (iv) Assist the institutions in achieving performance goals in
30 accordance with the Accountability Reporting Program; and

31 (v) Provide technical assistance to institutions and centers such as
32 legal and financial services.

1 (e) Each campus of the University System of Maryland shall have a president
2 who is the chief executive officer of the institution.

3 (f) The University System of Maryland shall:

4 (1) Maintain and enhance the **UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND**, College Park
5 [campus] **CAMPUS** as the State's flagship campus with programs and faculty nationally
6 and internationally recognized for excellence in research and the advancement of
7 knowledge;

8 (2) Admit as freshmen to the **UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND**, College Park
9 [campus] **CAMPUS** highly qualified students who have academic profiles that suggest
10 exceptional ability;

11 (3) Provide access to the upper division undergraduate level of the
12 **UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND**, College Park [campus] **CAMPUS** for students who have
13 excelled in completing lower division study; and

14 (4) Provide the **UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND**, College Park [campus]
15 **CAMPUS** with the level of operating funding and facilities necessary to place it among the
16 upper echelon of its peer institutions.

18 (b) (5) (i) With respect to the College Park [campus] **CAMPUS** of the
19 University of Maryland, the Commission shall direct the Board of Regents of the University
20 **SYSTEM** of Maryland to develop and implement a plan for the enhancement of that campus
21 as the State's flagship campus with programs and faculty nationally and internationally
22 recognized for excellence in research and the advancement of knowledge.

23 (ii) With respect to the constituent institutions of the University
24 System of Maryland in the Baltimore region, the Commission shall direct the Board of

30 (2) "Board" or "Board of Regents" means the Board of Regents of the
31 University System of Maryland.

32 (3) "Centers" or "institutes" means the following components of the System
33 under the jurisdiction of the Board of Regents:

- 1 (i) University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science;
2 (ii) Cooperative Extension Service and the Agricultural Experiment
3 Station;
4 (iii) Statewide Medical Education and Training System;
5 (iv) Fire and Rescue Institute;
6 (v) **CENTER FOR MARYLAND ADVANCED VENTURES;**
7 (vi) **UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND CENTER FOR ECONOMIC AND**
8 **ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT;** and

9 [(v)] (vii) Any other center, component, or institute established and
10 operated by the System in accordance with its mission.

11 (4) “Chancellor” means the Chief Executive Officer of the University
12 System of Maryland and the Chief of Staff for the Board of Regents.

13 (5) “Computer-based instructional technology” means computer hardware
14 or software used by faculty and students in the delivery of the instructional program.

15 (6) “Constituent institutions”, “institutions”, or “campuses” means the
16 following public senior higher education institutions under the jurisdiction of the Board of
17 Regents:

- 18 (i) University of Maryland[, Baltimore];
19 (ii) University of Maryland Baltimore County;
20 (iii) [University of Maryland, College Park;
21 (iv)] University of Maryland Eastern Shore;
22 [(v)] (iv) University of Maryland University College;
23 [(vi)] (v) Bowie State University;
24 [(vii)] (vi) Coppin State University;
25 [(viii)] (vii) Frostburg State University;
26 [(ix)] (viii) Salisbury University;
27 [(x)] (ix) Towson University; and

1 ~~[(xi)]~~ **(X)** University of Baltimore.

2 (7) “President” means the Chief Executive Officer of a constituent
3 institution of the University System of Maryland.

4 (8) “Quasi–endowment funds” means funds that the University System of
5 Maryland retains and manages in the same manner as an endowment.

6 (9) “Technology” means the latest state–of–the–art technology products
7 and services, including:

8 (i) Copper and fiber optic transmission;

9 (ii) Computer;

10 (iii) Video and audio laser and CD–ROM discs;

11 (iv) Video and audio tapes or other technologies; and

12 (v) Technology used for online learning.

13 (10) “University” [or “University of Maryland”] or “University of Maryland
14 System” means the University System of Maryland.

15 **(11) “UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND” MEANS:**

16 **(I) THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, BALTIMORE CAMPUS;**

17 **AND**

18 **(II) THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK CAMPUS.**

20 (b) In addition to the powers set forth elsewhere in this title, the University may:

21 (1) Exercise all the corporate powers granted Maryland corporations under
22 the Maryland General Corporation Law;

23 (2) Adopt and alter an official seal;

24 (3) Sue and be sued, complain, and defend in all courts;

25 (4) [Maintain an office at the place the Board of Regents may designate;

1 (5) Enter into contracts of any kind, and execute all instruments necessary
2 or convenient with respect to its carrying out the powers in this subtitle to accomplish the
3 purposes of the University;

4 [(6)] (5) Subject to the provisions of subsection (h) of this section, acquire,
5 hold, lease, use, encumber, transfer, exchange, or dispose of real and personal property;

6 [(7)] (6) Borrow money from any source to acquire personal property as
7 provided in § 12-105(c) of this subtitle; and

8 [(8)] (7) In addition to the powers set forth in Title 19 of this article and
9 subject to the approval of the Board of Public Works, borrow money from any source for any
10 corporate purpose, including working capital for its operations, reserve funds or interest,
11 and mortgage, pledge, or otherwise encumber the property or funds of the University, and
12 contract with or engage the services of any person in connection with any financing,
13 including financial institutions, issuers of credit, or insurers.

14 **(B-1) THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND SHALL MAINTAIN ITS**
15 **HEADQUARTERS IN BALTIMORE CITY AT A PLACE DESIGNATED BY THE BOARD.**

17 (a) (2) After the Board submits the requests for appropriations to the
18 Commission, Governor, and General Assembly, on a date set by the Governor, the President
19 of the University of Maryland, College Park **CAMPUS** shall have the opportunity to meet
20 with the Governor to present the institution's annual budget request and proposals for
21 capital projects for the next fiscal year to:

22 (i) Discuss how the requests for appropriations submitted by the
23 Board impacts the mission of the University of Maryland, College Park **CAMPUS** as the
24 State's flagship institution; and

25 (ii) Recommend that the Governor approve or enhance the requests
26 for appropriations submitted by the Board.

28 (a) (1) In consultation with the presidents of the constituent institutions, the
29 Chancellor shall develop an overall plan that:

33 and internationally recognized for excellence in research and the advancement of
34 knowledge;

1 B. Admit to the campus freshmen who have academic profiles
2 that suggest exceptional ability;

5 D. Provide the campus with the level of operating funding
6 and facilities necessary to place it among the upper echelon of its peer institutions;

8 (a) [In] **EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBTITLE 3 OF THIS TITLE**, IN consultation
9 with the Chancellor and after a thorough search, the Board of Regents shall appoint a
10 qualified person as president of each constituent institution.

11 (f) (3) The report of the University of Maryland, College Park **CAMPUS** Board
12 of Visitors shall include:

13 (i) The Board of Visitors' evaluation of the status of the effort by the
14 University System of Maryland and the State in meeting the requirements of the Maryland
15 Charter for Higher Education set forth in § 10–209 of this article which require the
16 University System of Maryland to:

17 1. Provide the College Park [campus]**CAMPUS** with the level
18 of operating funding and facilities necessary to place it among the upper echelon of its peer
