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## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 **United States Constitution – Amendments Convention – Limitations on Federal**  
3 **Power**

4 FOR the purpose of applying to the U.S. Congress for an amendments convention called  
5 under Article V of the U.S. Constitution, on the application of the legislatures of  
6 two-thirds of the several states, to propose amendments to the U.S. Constitution  
7 that impose fiscal restraints on the federal government, limit the power and  
8 jurisdiction of the federal government, and limit the terms of office for officials of the  
9 federal government and for the members of the U.S. Congress; and generally relating  
10 to an application to Congress for a convention to propose amendments to the U.S.  
11 Constitution.

12 WHEREAS, The Founders of our Constitution empowered state legislators to be  
13 guardians of liberty against future abuses of power by the federal government; and

14 WHEREAS, The federal government has created a crushing national debt through  
15 improper and imprudent spending; and

16 WHEREAS, The federal government has invaded the legitimate roles of the states  
17 through the manipulative process of federal mandates, many of which to a great extent are  
18 unfunded; and

19 WHEREAS, The federal government has ceased to live under a proper interpretation  
20 of the Constitution of the United States; and

21 WHEREAS, It is the solemn duty of the states to protect the liberty of our  
22 people – particularly for the generations to come – and to propose amendments to the  
23 Constitution of the United States through a Convention of the States under Article V of the  
24 U.S. Constitution that would place clear restraints on abuses of power by the U.S. Congress;  
25 now, therefore, be it



1           RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That, as provided  
2 in Article V of the U.S. Constitution, the General Assembly of Maryland respectfully applies  
3 to the U.S. Congress for an amendments convention to be called as soon as two-thirds of  
4 the several states have applied for a convention, for the purpose of proposing an  
5 amendment to the U.S. Constitution that imposes fiscal restraints on the federal  
6 government, limits the power and jurisdiction of the federal government, and limits the  
7 terms of office for officials of the federal government and for the members of the U.S.  
8 Congress; and be it further

9           RESOLVED, That delegates to the convention from Maryland may not propose  
10 amendments that do not have the primary goals of addressing the goals listed in this Joint  
11 Resolution; and be it further

12           RESOLVED, That this application constitutes a continuing application in  
13 accordance with Article V of the U.S. Constitution until at least two-thirds of the  
14 legislatures of the several states have made application for an equivalently limited  
15 amendments convention; and be it further

3       RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State is directed to send copies of this Joint  
4 Resolution to the presiding officers of both Houses of the legislature of each of the several  
5 states, with the request that it be circulated among leaders in the legislative branch of the  
6 state governments; and with the further request that each of the states join in requesting  
7 the U.S. Congress to call an amendments convention for the purpose of initiating a proposal  
8 to amend the U.S. Constitution as described in this Joint Resolution.
