3 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2016,**
4 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010,**

6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~One Billion,~~

11 building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement,
12 and capital equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real estate in
13 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations
14 for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to certain requirements
15 that certain matching funds be provided and expended by certain dates; providing

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That:

15 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
16 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
17 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2016 in the total principal amount of ~~\$1,002,385,000~~
18 ~~\$998,686,000~~ \$1,005,072,199. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and
19 delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public
20 Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 and
21 8-131.2 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

22 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a
23 single issue of bonds under § 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

24 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and
25 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the
26 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on
27 the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for
28 the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:
