BY adding to Article - Election Law Section 13–236.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (2010 Replacement Volume and 2015 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Election Law 13-236.1. <del>(A)</del> IN THIS SECTION. A "FOREIGN NATIONAL" MEANS: <del>(1)</del> AN INDIVIDUAL WITH FOREIGN CITIZENSHIP; OR
