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Health – Sale of Food Products Containing Alcohol – Requirements and Restrictions

4 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain provision of law that provided that a confectionary 5 food product is adulterated if it contains any alcohol in excess of a certain percent by 6 volume or any alcohol derived from anything but flavoring extracts; prohibiting 7 certain provisions of law from being construed to prohibit the addition of alcohol to 8 a food product, including a confectionary and a frozen dessert; prohibiting the sale of 9 a food product that contains more than a certain percent of alcohol per volume to 10 certain individuals; requiring that a food product that contains more than a certain 11 percent of alcohol per volume state certain information on the label of the food 12 product; providing that a certain provision of this Act may not be construed to limit 13 the application of certain laws and regulations to certain food products; repealing 14 certain provisions of law rendered obsolete by this Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the sale of food products containing 15 16 alcohol.
