- 3 FOR the purpose of expanding the types of festivals that a holder of a beer and wine festival
- 4 license may hold in Anne Arundel County; authorizing the Anne Arundel County
- 5 Board of License Commissioners to issue a certain beer and wine festival license to
- 6 certain nonprofit organizations under certain circumstances; providing that,
- 7 notwithstanding certain other provisions of law, a certain license holder may display
- 8 and sell beer and wine at a certain beer and wine festival without holding certain
