  eligibility criteria; defining certain terms; and generally relating to mental health
  and wraparound services for children and youth.

### Preamble

15 WHEREAS, Wraparound is a research-based practice model shown to produce 16 better outcomes and reduce costs by serving children and youth with severe mental health 17 problems in their communities; and

18 WHEREAS, Maryland has been implementing wraparound throughout the State for19 over a decade; and

WHEREAS, Since the implementation of wraparound in the State, placements of children and youth with severe mental health problems in residential treatment centers and group homes have declined significantly, resulting in improved outcomes and lower cost; and

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



#### SENATE BILL 858

1 WHEREAS, Programs that provided wraparound to children and youth with severe 2 mental health problems, regardless of the income or insurance status of their families, have 3 ended; and

WHEREAS, The recently implemented 1915(i) Medicaid State Plan Amendment, intended to provide wraparound to children and youth with severe mental health problems, is available only to a small population of children and youth because the medical necessity criteria are more stringent than the requirements for wraparound and the family of a child or youth must be Medicaid eligible and make below 151% of the federal poverty level; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
