1 AN ACT concerning

State Board of Heating, Ventilation, Air–Conditioning, and Refrigeration Contractors – Maintenance Technician – License Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the qualifications for a maintenance technician license to $\mathbf{5}$ be issued by the State Board of Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning, and 6 Refrigeration Contractors; establishing a certain fee for the issuance or renewal of a 7 maintenance technician license; limiting the subjects on a certain examination for a 8 certain license; authorizing the Board to waive certain examination requirements for 9 certain individuals who are licensed in another state to provide certain services 10 under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to send a certain notice to a certain 11 applicant under certain circumstances; providing that a licensed maintenance 12 technician need not obtain separate insurance while providing or assisting in the 13providing of certain services under certain circumstances; prohibiting an individual 14 from exclusively providing general maintenance services on certain systems without 15a certain license; defining certain terms; altering the definition of a certain term; and 16 generally relating to license requirements for a maintenance technician license.
