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# State Board of Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning, and Refrigeration Contractors - Maintenance Technician - License Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the qualifications for a maintenance technician license to 5 be issued by the State Board of Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning, and 6 Refrigeration Contractors; establishing a certain fee for the issuance or renewal of a 7 maintenance technician license; limiting the subjects on a certain examination for a 8 certain license; authorizing the Board to waive certain examination requirements for 9 certain individuals who are licensed in another state to provide certain services 10 under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to send a certain notice to a certain 11 applicant under certain circumstances; providing that a licensed maintenance 12 technician need not obtain separate insurance while providing or assisting in the 13 providing of certain services under certain circumstances; prohibiting an individual 14 from exclusively providing general maintenance services on certain systems without 15 a certain license; defining certain terms; altering the definition of a certain term; and 16 generally relating to license requirements for a maintenance technician license.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 1 (b) "Board" means the State Board of Heating, Ventilation, Air—Conditioning, and 2 Refrigeration Contractors.
- 3 (c) "Contractor" means a heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration 4 contractor.
- 5 (d) (1) "Cooling system" means a system in which heat is removed from air, 6 surrounding surfaces, or both.
- 7 (2) "Cooling system" includes an air-conditioning system.
- 8 (e) "Forced air system" means a heating system that uses air being moved by 9 mechanical means to transmit heat.
- 10 (f) (1) "Heating system" means a system in which heat is transmitted by radiation, conduction, or convection, or a combination of any of these methods, to the air, surrounding surfaces, or both.
- 13 (2) "Heating system" does not include a fireplace or woodburning stove not incorporated into or used as a primary heating system.
- 15 (g) "Heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration contractor" means 16 an individual who provides heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, or refrigeration services.
- 17 (h) "Hydronic system" means a heating and cooling system using liquids or steam 18 to transmit or remove heat.
- 19 (i) "Independent agency" means an office, commission, board, department, or 20 agency established as an independent unit of government that may receive budgetary or 21 administrative support from the federal, State, or local government.
- 22 (j) "Journeyman license" means a license issued by the Board to provide heating, 23 ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration services while under the direction and 24 control of a licensed contractor.
- 25 (k) "Journeyman restricted license" means a license issued by the Board to 26 provide heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration services while under the 27 direction and control of a licensed contractor, in only one of the following areas:

  - (1) have been regularly and principally employed in providing refrigeration, air—conditioning, forced air heating, hydronic heating, or ventilation services under a journeyman, journeyman restricted, limited, or master restricted license for not less than 3 years of active experience under the direction and control of a master or master restricted heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration contractor and have been so employed for not less than 1,875 hours in the year prior to application; and
- 21 (2) pass an examination administered by the Board.
- 22 (d) An applicant for a limited heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and 23 refrigeration license shall:
  - (1) have been regularly and principally employed in providing forced air heating, hydronic heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, or refrigeration services under a journeyman license for not less than 2 years of active experience under the direction and control of the holder of a master, master restricted, or limited license under this title, and have been so employed for not less than 1,000 hours in the year prior to application; and
- 29 (2) pass an examination administered by the Board.
- 30 (e) An applicant for a journeyman license shall:
- 31 (1) have held, for a period of at least 3 years, an apprentice license, and 32 during that period shall have completed at least 1,875 hours of training in providing 33 heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration services under the direction and 34 control of a licensed contractor; and
  - (2) pass an examination administered by the Board.

- 1 (f) An applicant for a journeyman restricted license shall:
- 2 (1) have held, for a period of at least 3 years, an apprentice license, and 3 during that period shall have completed at least 1,875 hours of training in providing forced 4 air heating, hydronic heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, or refrigeration services under 5 the direction and control of a licensed contractor; and
  - (2) pass an examination administered by the Board.

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#### (G) AN APPLICANT FOR A MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN LICENSE SHALL:

- 9 PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE ON EQUIPMENT FOR HEATING SYSTEMS, VENTILATION SYSTEMS, COOLING SYSTEMS, AND REFRIGERATION SYSTEMS FOR NOT LESS THAN 2 YEARS OF ACTIVE EXPERIENCE UNDER THE DIRECTION AND CONTROL OF A LICENSED CONTRACTOR UNDER THIS TITLE OR IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, AND HAVE BEEN SO EMPLOYED FOR NOT LESS THAN 3,750 HOURS IN THE 2 YEARS PRIOR TO THE APPLICATION;
- 15 (2) BE ENROLLED IN AT LEAST THE SECOND YEAR OF AN APPRENTICE
  16 PROGRAM APPROVED BY THE BOARD, OR HAVE DOCUMENTED TRAINING THROUGH

  - (c) (1) A licensed apprentice, LICENSED MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN, licensed journeyman, or licensed journeyman restricted in the employ of a master, master restricted, or limited licensee need not obtain separate insurance while providing or assisting in providing heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, or refrigeration services under the control and supervision of the licensee.
- 9 (2) Subject to the restrictions of § 9A-309 of this title regarding inactive status, inactive licensees who have had their inactive status approved by the Board need not obtain insurance while maintaining inactive status.
- 12 (d) (1) An applicant for any license under this title shall submit proof of the 13 insurance required under this section to the Board with the license application.
- 14 (2) Unless the applicant submits proof of insurance, the Board may not issue any license to an applicant to whom the insurance requirements of this section apply.
- 16 (e) Unless an applicant meets the insurance requirements of this section, the 17 Board may not renew any license of the applicant to whom the insurance requirements of 18 this section apply.
- 19 (f) A holder of a master, master restricted, or limited license shall give the Board 20 notice of the cancellation of insurance at least 10 days before the effective date of the 21 cancellation.
  - (g) If a county, municipal corporation, special taxing district, or other political subdivision requires a master, master restricted, or limited heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration license holder, or other person who engages in the business of providing heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration services, to execute a surety bond under local heating, ventilation, air—conditioning, and refrigeration requirements, the person may satisfy the bond requirement by submitting proof of the insurance required under this section.

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- Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual may not assist, attempt to assist, or offer to assist in providing heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, or refrigeration services unless issued a master restricted license by the Board.
- Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual may not exclusively (c) maintain or repair heating systems, cooling systems, refrigeration systems, ventilation systems, or hydronic systems in the State unless issued a limited license by the Board.
- 7 (D) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS TITLE, AN INDIVIDUAL MAY 8 NOT PROVIDE, ATTEMPT TO PROVIDE, OR OFFER TO PROVIDE GENERAL PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE ON HEATING SYSTEMS, COOLING SYSTEMS, REFRIGERATION SYSTEMS, OR VENTILATION SYSTEMS IN THE STATE UNLESS ISSUED A MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN LICENSE BY THE BOARD.
