SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 United States Constitution – Amendments Convention – Limitations on Federal 3 Power

4 FOR the purpose of applying to the U.S. Congress for an amendments convention called $\mathbf{5}$ under Article V of the U.S. Constitution, on the application of the legislatures of 6 two-thirds of the several states, to propose amendments to the U.S. Constitution 7 that imposes fiscal restraints on the federal government, limits the power and 8 jurisdiction of the federal government, and limits the terms of office for officials of 9 the federal government and for the members of the U.S. Congress; and generally relating to an application to Congress for a convention to propose amendments to the 10 11 U.S. Constitution.

12 WHEREAS, The Founders of our Constitution empowered state legislators to be 13 guardians of liberty against future abuses of power by the federal government; and

WHEREAS, The federal government has created a crushing national debt throughimproper and imprudent spending; and

16 WHEREAS, The federal government has invaded the legitimate roles of the states 17 through the manipulative process of federal mandates, many of which to a great extent are 18 unfunded; and

WHEREAS, The federal government has ceased to live under a proper interpretationof the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, It is the solemn duty of the states to protect the liberty of our people – particularly for the generations to come – and to propose amendments to the Constitution of the United States through a Convention of the States under Article V of the U.S. Constitution that would place clear restraints on abuses of power by the U.S. Congress; now, therefore, be it



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1 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That, as provided 2 in Article V of the U.S. Constitution, the General Assembly of Maryland respectfully applies 3 to the U.S. Congress for an amendments convention to be called as soon as two-thirds of 4 the several states have applied for a convention, for the purpose of proposing amendments 5 to the U.S. Constitution that imposes fiscal restraints on the federal government, limits the 6 power and jurisdiction of the federal government, and limits the terms of office for officials 7 of the federal government and for the members of the U.S. Congress; and be it further

8 RESOLVED, That delegates to the convention from Maryland may not propose 9 amendments that do not have the primary goals of addressing the goals listed in this Joint 10 Resolution; and be it further

11 RESOLVED, That this application constitutes a continuing application in 12 accordance with Article V of the U.S. Constitution until at least two-thirds of the 13 legislatures of the several states have made application for an equivalently limited 14 amendments convention; and be it further

3 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State is directed to send copies of this Joint 4 Resolution to the presiding officers of both Houses of the legislature of each of the several 5 states, with the request that it be circulated among leaders in the legislative branch of the 6 state governments; and with the further request that each of the states join in requesting 7 the U.S. Congress to call an amendments convention for the purpose of initiating a proposal 8 to amend the U.S. Constitution as described in this Joint Resolution.
