10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

The City of College Park comprises approximately 30,000 residents in five square miles situated primarily along Baltimore Avenue seven miles northeast of Washington, D.C. The City was incorporated in 1945, and is the home of the University of Maryland, College Parks vision includes becoming a vibrant and prosperous top 20 college town with distinctive neighborhoods, thriving commercial districts, cultural amenities, attractive streetscapes, transportation systems serving all users, and a strong sense of community pride.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

This is a phased streetscape project in the Hollywood Commercial District. Phase 1 is focused on the design and construction of roadway and streetscape improvements to improve circulation and access for the local businesses, and provide enhanced infrastructure for walking and biking. The project also includes green spaces and gathering spots by repurposing unnecessary service roads. The purpose of the project is to reconstruct the public realm (right-of-way) to provide a more functional and aesthetically pleasing environment. The area currently lacks public amenities and is auto-oriented (more than 11,000 cars per day). It is anticipated that the public investment in the streetscape will be followed by private investment and redevelopment as proposed in the overlay zone and plan for this area. An Existing Conditions Report and Conceptual Design Recommendations were completed for this project in spring 2015 and have widespread support from the community.
