10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Ulman Cancer Fund for Young Adults was created by Doug Ulman and his family in 1997 after Doug was diagnosed with cancer during college and had difficulty finding resources for people his age. Frustrated by this void, the Ulman Family established UCF to create a community of support for young adults (ages 15-39) and families facing cancer. UCF continues to be driven by the goal of ensuring that no young adult has to face cancer alone and remains steadfast in its mission to work for and with young adults and their families as they battle cancer by offering support, resources, and a community that recognizes the profound effect of cancer on young peoples lives. UCF provides free, innovative, and impactful programs for young adults, and their loved ones, affected by cancer, including: Patient Navigation (at Hopkins and UMD), Scholarships, and Cancer to 5K.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

In 2016, UCF will break ground on a "home away from home" to provide free lodging for young adult cancer patients, and their caregivers, in East Baltimore that will create a community that fosters peer and social support, decreases financial and other burdens, and encourages hope and healing. The House will offer eight private suites for patients and families; a suite for an onsite House Manager; large, open, communal living and dining spaces on the first floor; a health and wellness space; a meditation/relaxation room; a resource library; and a nice-sized backyard. We will also offer programming out of the House, including patient navigation services, support groups, and other social activities designed to address the feelings of social isolation experienced by young adults after a cancer diagnosis. The location of the properties in East Baltimore provides an opportunity for UCF to invest in and have a positive impact in the community.

28. Comments

Clarification regarding Funding for the project:

Questions 13 and 15 ask about proposed and actual funds raised to date. To provide context for the information we provided, it is important to know that we are raising funds to build The UCF House through a \$3 million Capital Campaign that will support three priority areas: (1) build/open the House (i.e., capital costs) and operate it for the first three years, (2) grow our endowment, and (3) enhance our ongoing programming. Thus, only a portion of the funds raised through our Capital Campaign are for the capital costs. We launched the quiet phase of the Campaign in Q3 2015 and publicly announced the House and Campaign at our annual Blue Jeans & Bowties gala on January 30th. We are making good progress but are still actively fundraising. For example, two weeks ago we submitted a grant proposal to a Baltimore foundation requesting a 5-figure gift. We expect to continue our fundraising efforts through at least the end of 2016.

In 13, we provided information about some of our lead gifts towards our Capital Campaign as well as the aggregate amount of other gifts and pledges received to date and expected. For each gift identified, we included the amount of the gift or pledge that will go towards the capital costs.

In 15, we provided a figure that represents the portion of the gifts and pledges we have secured to date that will be used for capital costs for this project.

Our bond bill request amount -- \$200,000 -- would reflect a signifiant level of support from the state, but is less than a quarter of the total capital costs we expect to spend for this project.
