## A BILL ENTITLED

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## Public Safety – Local Law Enforcement Surveillance Programs and Equipment Reporting

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a local law enforcement agency to send written notification within a certain time period to the local governing body of the county or municipal 5 6 corporation in which the local law enforcement agency is located on the initiation of 7 the operation of electronic surveillance equipment; requiring certain local law 8 enforcement agencies to submit, on or before a certain date annually, a 9 comprehensive report to the local governing body of the county or municipal 10 corporation in which the local law enforcement agency is located regarding the 11 operation of all electronic surveillance programs and equipment by the local law enforcement agency in the previous calendar year; providing for a delayed effective 12 date; and generally relating to the operation of electronic surveillance programs and 13 equipment by local law enforcement agencies. 14

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Public Safety

23 **3-520.** 

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- 1 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY" MEANS AN 2 AGENCY OF A COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION IN THE STATE THAT PERFORMS 3 POLICE PROTECTION FUNCTIONS.
- 4 (B) WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER INITIATING THE OPERATION OF ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE EQUIPMENT, A LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL SEND WRITTEN NOTIFICATION OF THE OPERATION OF THE EQUIPMENT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION IN WHICH THE LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IS LOCATED.
- 9 (C) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 31 ANNUALLY, EACH LOCAL LAW
  10 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY THAT OPERATES ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE EQUIPMENT
  11 SHALL SUBMIT A COMPREHENSIVE REPORT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNING BODY OF
  12 THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION IN WHICH THE LOCAL LAW
  13 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IS LOCATED REGARDING THE OPERATION OF ALL
  14 ELECTRONIC SURVEILLANCE PROGRAMS AND EQUIPMENT BY THE LOCAL LAW
  15 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IN THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect January 1, 2018.
