2 Unemployment Insurance - Recovery of Benefits - Collection by Assessment

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to 4 recover unemployment insurance benefits by assessment in the same manner as 5 provided in a certain provision of law for the assessment of past due contributions; 6 requiring the Secretary, if the Secretary seeks to recover certain unemployment 7 benefits by assessment, to allow a claimant to elect within a certain period of time to 8 have the amount collected by suit instead of by assessment; requiring the Secretary 9 to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to the recovery of unemployment 10 insurance benefits by assessment.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 1 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article - Labor and Employment 8-629. 4 5 If an employing unit fails to submit a contribution and employment report 6 under § 8–626 of this subtitle, the Secretary: 7 (1) may assess the penalty imposed under that section; and 8 (2)shall mail written notice of the assessment to the employer at the last 9 known address of the employer or otherwise deliver the notice. 10 If an employing unit fails to submit a separation notice under § 8–627 of this 11 subtitle, the Secretary: 12 (1) may assess the penalty imposed under that section; and 13 (2)shall mail written notice of the assessment to the employer at the last known address of the employer or otherwise deliver the notice. 14 If an employing unit submits a report for determination of the amount 15 (c) 16 of contributions due under this title but fails to pay the contributions or interest, the 17 Secretary: 18 (i) may assess the amount of contributions or interest due on the basis of the information in the report; 19 20 (ii) shall mail written notice of the assessment to the employing unit 21at the last known address of the employing unit or otherwise deliver the notice; and 22 notwithstanding subsection (f) of this section, may make an (iii) 23 additional assessment if the report subsequently is found to be incorrect. 24If an employing unit under an election fails to make a reimbursement (2)payment or pay interest on the payment, the Secretary: 25 26 (i) may assess the amount of the payment or interest due; and 27 (ii) shall mail written notice of the assessment to the employing unit 28 at the last known address of the employing unit or otherwise deliver the notice.

Payments made by checks or other negotiable instruments returned for

insufficient funds shall be considered a failure to pay contributions or reimbursements due

under this subsection and are subject to an additional penalty of \$25.

1 (d) If an employing unit fails to submit a report under an election or for (1) 2 determination of the amount of contributions due on or before the date required by 3 regulation, or if the Secretary determines that a report submitted by an employing unit is 4 incorrect or insufficient, the Secretary shall require by written notice that the employing 5 unit submit a correct and sufficient report. 6 An employing unit shall submit a correct and sufficient report within 7 10 days after the Secretary requires it. 8 If an employing unit fails to comply with paragraph (2) of this 9 subsection, the Secretary shall: 10 make an assessment on the basis of any information that the 11 Secretary is able to obtain; and 12 (ii) mail written notice of assessment to the employing unit at the 13 last known address of the employing unit or otherwise deliver the notice. 14 (e) Regardless of whether the time allowed under this title for submitting reports or contributions or making reimbursement payments has expired, if the Secretary 15 believes that collection will be jeopardized by delay, the Secretary immediately may assess 16 17 a contribution, reimbursement payment, or interest. 18 The Secretary shall mail written notice to an employing unit of an (2)19 assessment under paragraph (1) of this subsection at the last known address of the employing unit or otherwise deliver the notice. 20 21 (f) (1) An assessment under this section is final unless: 22 (i) within 15 days after the mailing of the assessment an employing 23 unit applies to the Board of Appeals for a hearing; or 24(ii) on its own motion, the Board of Appeals reduces the contribution 25 or interest. 26 (2)After a hearing held under this subsection, the Board of Appeals shall: 27 pass an order to affirm, modify, or set aside the assessment; and (i) 28 promptly give an employing unit written notice of its decision. (ii) 29 (1) If an employing unit fails to pay an assessment under this section, the (g) 30 Secretary may file with the clerk of the circuit court of the county where the employing


