## 1 AN ACT concerning

Public Health - Treatment of Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder Identification and Posting Notice of Guidelines Information

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to develop 5 identify, in consultation with the Maryland Chapter of the American Academy of 6 Pediatrics, a certain notice that explains the guidelines of the Centers for Disease 7 Control and Prevention for the treatment of certain stakeholders, certain 8 information relating to attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder in children and 9 adolescents and to post the notice in a certain form on a certain; requiring the 10 Department to post certain information in a certain form on the Department's Web site; requiring certain health care practitioners to publicly and conspicuously display 11 the notice in a certain office; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the 12 identification and notice posting of guidelines information for the treatment of 13 children and adolescents with attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder. 14

- 19 (II) IS DESIGNED FOR USE BY HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONERS
- 20 AND THE FAMILIES OF CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS WHO ARE DIAGNOSED WITH
- 21 ATTENTION-DEFICIT/HYPERACTIVITY DISORDER;
- 22 (III) IS CULTURALLY AND LINGUISTICALLY APPROPRIATE FOR
- 23 POTENTIAL RECIPIENTS OF THE INFORMATION; AND

- 26 ATTENTION-DEFICIT/HYPERACTIVITY DISORDER, INCLUDING MEDICATION USAGE,
