- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to develop, in consultation with the Maryland Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, a 5 6 certain notice that explains the guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control and 7 Prevention for the treatment of attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder in children 8 and adolescents and to post the notice in a certain form on a certain Web site; 9 requiring certain health care practitioners to publicly and conspicuously display the 10 notice in a certain office; defining a certain term; and generally relating to notice of 11 guidelines for the treatment of children and adolescents with attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder. 12

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

22 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER" MEANS A PERSON 23 WHO IS LICENSED, CERTIFIED, OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS ARTICLE

- 4 (1) DEVELOP, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE MARYLAND CHAPTER OF

- 10 (2) POST THE NOTICE IN PRINTABLE FORM ON THE DEPARTMENT'S
- 11 WEB SITE.
- 12 (C) IF A HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER IS ENGAGED IN TREATING CHILDREN
- 13 AND ADOLESCENTS FOR ATTENTION-DEFICIT/HYPERACTIVITY DISORDER, THE
- 14 HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER SHALL PUBLICLY AND CONSPICUOUSLY DISPLAY THE
- 15 NOTICE DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(1) OF THIS SECTION IN EACH OFFICE
- 16 WHERE THE HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER IS ENGAGED IN PRACTICE.
