1 AN ACT concerning

Task Force to Study Bicycle Safety on Maryland Highways

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study Bicycle Safety on Maryland 4 Highways; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; $\mathbf{5}$ prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but 6 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to 7 study and make recommendations on certain issues related to bicycle safety on highways in the State; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and 8 9 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task 10 11 Force to Study Bicycle Safety on Maryland Highways.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,13 That:

- 14 (a) There is a Task Force to Study Bicycle Safety on Maryland Highways.
- 15 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 16 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of 17 the Senate:
- 18 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 19 the House;

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 261, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2018, with 27no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no 28further force and effect.
