1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Junk Dealers and Scrap Metal Processors – Cell Tower Batteries – Required**
3 **Record**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of junk or scrap metal to include cell tower
5 batteries; requiring a junk dealer or scrap metal processor to keep a certain record
6 of each purchase of a cell tower battery in the State; and generally relating to
7 required records for the purchase of cell tower batteries by junk dealers and scrap
8 metal processors.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Business Regulation**

3 (e) (1) "Junk" or "scrap metal" includes:

4 (i) nonferrous articles made wholly or substantially of:

- 6 2. babbitt metal;
- 7 3. brass;
- 8 4. bronze;
- 9 5. light copper;
- 10 6. heavy copper;
- 11 7. lead;
- 12 8. low carbon chrome;
- 13 9. low carbon manganese;
- 14 10. molybdenum;
- 15 11. monel metal;
- 16 12. pewter;
- 17 13. nickel;
- 18 14. stainless steel;
- 19 15. tin;
- 20 16. vanadium;
- 21 17. zinc;
- 22 18. platinum;
- 23 19. gold;

1 20. rhodium; or

2 21. other nonferrous metals; and

3 (ii) the following used articles, made of either ferrous or nonferrous
4 metal:

5 1. catalytic converters;

6 2. metal bleachers;

7 3. hard-drawn copper;

8 4. metal beer kegs;

9 5. cemetery urns;

10 6. grave markers;

11 7. propane tanks; [and]

12 **8. CELL TOWER BATTERIES; AND**

13 **[8.] 9.** any other used articles owned by a public utility
14 including:

15 A. guardrails;

16 B. manhole covers;

17 C. metal light poles;

18 D. tree grates;

19 E. water meters; and

20 F. street signs.

21 (2) "Junk" or "scrap metal" does not include beverage cans or food cans.

23 (b) (1) For each purchase of junk or scrap metal in the State, a junk dealer or
24 scrap metal processor shall keep an accurate record in English.

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
26 October 1, 2017.
