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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Government – Closed Captioning Activation Required Without Request**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring places of public accommodation to keep closed captioning  
4 activated on certain television receivers under certain circumstances regardless of  
5 whether the closed captioning was requested; and generally relating to activation of  
6 closed captioning on television receivers in places of public accommodation.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – State Government**

15 20–306.

16 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

17 (2) “Closed captioning” means a transcript or dialog of the audio portion of  
18 a television program that is displayed on a television receiver screen when the user  
19 activates the feature.

20 (3) “Closed–captioning television receiver” means a receiver of television  
21 programming that has the ability to display closed captioning, including a television, digital  
22 set top box, and any other technology capable of displaying closed captioning.

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EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1           (4) “Public area” means a part of a place of public accommodation that is  
2 open to the general public.

3           (5) “Regular hours” means the hours of any day in which a place of public  
4 accommodation is open to members of the general public.

5           (b) [On request, a] A place of public accommodation may not fail to keep closed  
6 captioning activated on any closed-captioning television receiver that is in use during  
7 regular hours in any public area.

8           (c) This section does not require a place of public accommodation to make closed  
9 captioning available in a public area of the place of public accommodation if:

10           (1) no television receiver of any kind is available in the public area; or

11           (2) the only public television receiver available in the public area is not a  
12 closed-captioning television receiver.

13           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
14 October 1, 2017.
