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

- and the prison population as measured on October 1, 2018, the comparison day, and the variable cost of incarceration.
- 3 (2) If the prison population on the comparison day is less than the prison 4 population on the baseline day, the Board shall determine a savings based on the difference 5 in the prison population multiplied by the variable cost.
- 6 (3) The Board annually shall determine the difference between the prison population on October 1, 2017, and the prison population on October 1 of the current year and calculate any savings in accordance with paragraph (2) of this subsection.
- 9 (4) If a prison population decline causes a correctional unit, wing, or facility to close, the Board shall conduct an assessment to determine the savings from the closure and distribute the savings, realized annually, according to the schedule in paragraph (5) of this subsection.
- 13 (5) The Board annually shall recommend that the savings identified in paragraphs (2) through (4) of this subsection be distributed as follows:
- 15 (i) up to 50% of the savings shall be placed in the Performance 16 Incentive Grant Fund for purposes established under § 9–3209(b)(1) of this subtitle; and
