

- 23 (4) A LICENSEE WHO COMPLETES DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL
 24 ASSAULT AWARENESS EDUCATION IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE CONTINUING
 25 EDUCATION REQUIREMENT IN THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE HELD CIVILLY OR
 26 CRIMINALLY LIABLE FOR ACTING IN GOOD FAITH OR FAILING TO ACT ON
 27 INFORMATION OBTAINED DURING THE COURSE OF EMPLOYMENT CONCERNING
 28 POTENTIAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OR SEXUAL ASSAULT.
- 29 (e) The Board shall renew the license of and issue a renewal certificate to each 30 licensee who meets the requirements of this section.
- 31 (f) (1) If an individual who, on or before September 30, 1999, holds a limited 32 license to provide esthetic services files an application to renew the license, the Board shall 33 grant a waiver of the requirement for completion of hours of instruction under §

- 5-305(b)(3)(ii) of this subtitle that are in addition to the hours of instruction required on or before that date.
- 3 (2) If an individual who, on or before September 30, 1999, holds a limited 4 license to provide manicuring services files an application to renew the license, the Board 5 shall grant a waiver of the requirement for completion of hours of instruction under § 5–305(d)(3)(ii) of this subtitle that are in addition to the hours of instruction required on or 5 before that date.
- 8 (G) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT SET, IN ACCORDANCE
 9 WITH THIS SECTION, A CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT AS A CONDITION OF
 10 THE RENEWAL OF LICENSES UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.
