## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Higher Education – Senatorial and Delegate Scholarships – Reimbursement of**  
3 **Certificate and License Programs**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain recipients of a senatorial scholarship to use the  
5 scholarship to reimburse certain expenses; exempting certain applicants from the  
6 requirement that certain senatorial scholarship recipients take a certain  
7 examination and be enrolled in certain institutions; authorizing certain students to  
8 use a delegate scholarship to reimburse certain expenses; making certain stylistic  
9 changes; and generally relating to the use of senatorial and delegate scholarships for  
10 the reimbursement of certificate and license programs at community colleges.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

23 **Article – Education**

1 18-401.

2 There is a program of senatorial scholarships in this State that are awarded under  
3 this subtitle.

4 18-402.

5 (a) (1) Except as provided in [paragraph] PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of this  
6 subsection, each applicant for a senatorial scholarship shall:

7 (i) Take a competitive examination administered by the Office; and

8 (ii) Be accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate,  
9 graduate, or professional program at an eligible institution; or be enrolled in a 2-year  
10 terminal certificate program in which the course work is acceptable for transfer credit for  
11 an accredited baccalaureate program in an eligible institution.

12 (2) An applicant is exempt from the examination if the applicant:

13 (i) Is attending an eligible institution and has completed at least 1  
14 year in good academic standing at the institution;

15 (ii) Graduated from high school at least 5 years before application  
16 for a senatorial scholarship;

17 (iii) Is accepted for admission to a private career institution, if the  
18 institution's curriculum is approved by the Commission, and the institution is accredited  
19 by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of  
20 Education; or

21 (iv) Is planning to attend or is attending a Maryland community  
22 college.

23 **(3) AN APPLICANT IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF**  
24 **PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION IF THE APPLICANT IS OR WAS ENROLLED IN A**  
25 **CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE PROGRAM AT A COMMUNITY COLLEGE.**

26 18-405.

27 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a senatorial scholarship  
28 may be used only at any COMMUNITY COLLEGE, undergraduate, graduate, or professional  
29 school in the State.

30 18-406.

1 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each recipient of a senatorial  
2 scholarship may hold the scholarship for 4 undergraduate academic years, subject to §  
3 18–406.1 of this subtitle, and 4 graduate academic years if the recipient:

4 (1) Is a full–time student;

5 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and

6 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 12  
7 semester hours of courses as an undergraduate or 9 semester hours of courses as a graduate  
8 student each semester leading to a degree.

9 (b) A recipient of an undergraduate or graduate senatorial scholarship may hold  
10 the scholarship, appropriately prorated, for 8 academic years if [he] **THE RECIPIENT**:

11 (1) Is a part–time student;

12 (2) Continues to be a resident of this State; and

13 (3) Continues to be a student at the institution and takes at least 6  
14 semester hours of courses each semester leading to a degree.

15 (c) Any recipient of a senatorial scholarship may use up to one–half of the yearly  
16 award for summer school.

17 (d) A recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a terminal certificate  
18 program as provided in § 18–402(a) of this subtitle may hold the scholarship for 2 years if  
19 [he] **THE RECIPIENT** is a full–time student and otherwise meets the conditions of  
20 subsection (a) of this section, or may hold the scholarship for 4 years if [he] **THE**  
21 **RECIPIENT** is a part–time student and otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (b) of  
22 this section.

23 **(E) A RECIPIENT OF A SENATORIAL SCHOLARSHIP WHO IS CURRENTLY**  
24 **ENROLLED, OR WAS ENROLLED WITHIN THE LAST 2 YEARS, IN A CERTIFICATE OR**  
25 **LICENSE PROGRAM AT A COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AS PROVIDED IN § 18–402(A)(3) OF**  
26 **THIS SUBTITLE, MAY USE THE SCHOLARSHIP TO REIMBURSE EDUCATIONAL**  
27 **EXPENSES AS DEFINED BY THE OFFICE UNDER § 18–405(B)(2) OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

28 **[(e)] (F)** Each recipient of a senatorial scholarship who is enrolled in a private  
29 postsecondary proprietary institution that is accredited by a national accrediting  
30 association approved by the United States Department of Education:

31 (1) May hold the scholarship for the completion of one program if the  
32 student otherwise meets the conditions of subsection (a)(1) and (2) of this section; and

1 (2) Shall complete the program within the length of time prescribed by the  
2 institution for the completion of the program.

3 18-501.

4 (a) There is a program of Delegate Scholarships in this State that are awarded  
5 under this subtitle.

6 18-506.

7 (a) As an alternative to the scholarship awards authorized by §§ 18-503 through  
8 18-505 of this subtitle, and subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, during  
9 each year in office each Delegate may award scholarships in a total amount equal to four  
10 times the tuition and mandatory fees for a full-time undergraduate student enrolled at the  
11 University of Maryland, College Park Campus for the academic year commencing in that  
12 year.

13 (b) A scholarship award under subsection (a) of this section:

14 (1) May not be for an amount less than \$200 or more than one-half of the  
15 total amount of scholarships authorized by subsection (a) of this section for that year;

16 (2) Shall be used at an eligible institution;

17 (3) May be used by:

18 (i) A graduate, undergraduate, or professional student; [or]

19 (ii) A student at a private career school within the State that is  
20 approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11-202 of this article  
21 and that is accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United  
22 States Department of Education; [and] **OR**

23 **(III) A STUDENT WHO IS CURRENTLY ENROLLED OR WAS**  
24 **ENROLLED IN THE LAST 2 YEARS IN A CERTIFICATE OR LICENSE PROGRAM AT A**  
25 **COMMUNITY COLLEGE, APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION, AS REIMBURSEMENT FOR**  
26 **EDUCATIONAL EXPENSES; AND**

27 (4) To the extent it is not used by the student, shall be reccredited to the  
28 Delegate's scholarship account and may be awarded in the next 12 months by that Delegate  
29 to another student pursuant to this section.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
31 October 1, 2017.
