1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Department of Education – Lacrosse Opportunities Program – Youth**
3 **Lacrosse Nonprofit Organizations**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a youth lacrosse nonprofit organization to submit an
5 application for a grant under the Lacrosse Opportunities Program; requiring the
6 State Superintendent of Schools or the State Superintendent’s designee to provide
7 grants to eligible youth lacrosse nonprofit organizations with programs that will
8 increase opportunities for minority students to participate in lacrosse; defining a
9 certain term; and generally relating to the Lacrosse Opportunities Program.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Education**

18 2–305.

19 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

1 (2) "Agency" means a local education agency serving a population of
2 students at least 80% of which are minority students.

3 (3) "Minority student" has the meaning stated in regulations adopted by
4 the State Superintendent.

5 (4) **"YOUTH LACROSSE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION" MEANS A**
6 **NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT:**

7 (I) **IS LOCATED IN A COUNTY WITH AN AGENCY;**

8 (II) **PROVIDES LACROSSE OPPORTUNITIES FOR CHILDREN**
9 **UNDER THE AGE OF 18; AND**

10 (III) **IS RECOGNIZED BY US LACROSSE AS A MEMBER OF THE**
11 **URBAN LACROSSE ALLIANCE.**

12 (b) (1) There is a Lacrosse Opportunities Program in the Department.

13 (2) The purpose of the Lacrosse Opportunities Program is to increase
14 opportunities for minority students to participate in lacrosse in their communities.

15 (c) The State Superintendent shall develop and administer the Lacrosse
16 Opportunities Program.

17 (d) (1) An agency **OR A YOUTH LACROSSE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION** may
18 submit an application to the Department to receive a grant for a program that is in
19 furtherance of the purpose of the Lacrosse Opportunities Program.

20 (2) An application shall include:

21 (i) A description of the scope and purpose of the proposed program;

22 (ii) A business plan that includes the estimated total cost of the
23 proposed program; and

24 (iii) Any other information required by the Department.

25 (e) In awarding a grant under the Lacrosse Opportunities Program, the
26 Department shall:

27 (1) Require the grantee to provide matching funds from any combination
28 of federal, county, municipal, or private sources; and

1 (2) Ensure that the grant does not exceed 50% of the total annual cost of
2 the grantee's program.

3 (f) The State Superintendent or the State Superintendent's designee shall:

4 (1) Review grant applications submitted in accordance with subsection (d)
5 of this section; and

6 (2) To the extent funds are available, provide grants to agencies AND
7 **YOUTH LACROSSE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS** that meet the requirements for a grant
8 under this section.

9 (g) For fiscal year 2014 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Governor shall include
10 in the annual budget submission at least \$40,000 for the Lacrosse Opportunities Program.

11 (h) The State Superintendent shall adopt regulations to implement this section.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
13 1, 2017.
