BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Criminal Procedure Section 8-401 Annotated Code of Maryland (2008 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Criminal Procedure 8–401.

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- 16 The failure to seek an appeal in a criminal case may not be construed as a waiver of the right to file a petition for writ of error coram nobis. 17
- 18 (B) UNLESS GOOD CAUSE IS SHOWN, A PETITION FOR WRIT OF ERROR 19 CORAM NOBIS MAY NOT BE FILED MORE THAN 3 YEARS AFTER THE PETITIONER
