Task Force on Organized Retail Crime Rings

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on Organized Retail Crime Rings; 4 providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the 5 6 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make 7 recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its 8 findings and recommendations to certain committees of the General Assembly on or 9 before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating 10 to the Task Force on Organized Retail Crime Rings.

 (h) On or before October 1, 2018, the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee and the House Judiciary Committee.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 6 months and, at the end of December 31, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
