13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17	(a) The Commission shall certify as a police officer each individual who:
18	(1) (i) satisfactorily meets the standards of the Commission; or
19 20 21	(ii) provides the Commission with sufficient evidence that the individual has satisfactorily completed a training program in another state of equal quality and content as required by the Commission;

- 1 (2) submits to a psychological evaluation by a psychologist approved by the 2 Commission; [and]
- 3 (3) submits to a criminal history records check in accordance with § 4 3–209.1 of this subtitle; **AND**
- 5 (4) (I) IS A UNITED STATES CITIZEN; OR
- 6 (II) IS LAWFULLY ADMITTED AS A PERMANENT RESIDENT OF 7 THE UNITED STATES.
- 8 (b) The Commission may certify as a police officer an individual who is not 9 considered a police officer under § 3–201(f)(3) of this subtitle if the individual meets the 10 selection and training standards of the Commission.
- 11 (c) Each certificate issued to a police officer under this subtitle remains the 12 property of the Commission.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
