BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Transportation Section 11-140.1 and 13-802 Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Transportation 11-140.1. "Off-highway recreational vehicle" means a vehicle that is: (a) (1) A motor—assisted or motor—driven vehicle that:
