Pharmacists - Dispensing of Prescription Drugs - Single Dispensing of Dosage Units

- FOR the purpose of authorizing, with a certain exception, a pharmacist to dispense, in a single dispensing and exercising the pharmacist's professional judgment, a quantity of a prescription drug that is up to a certain number of authorized dosage units and does not exceed a certain supply of the prescription drug; providing that this Act does not apply to a certain controlled dangerous substance, certain prescriptions that an authorized prescriber prescribes for a patient, or a certain supply of prescription contraceptives; defining a certain term; and generally relating to pharmacists and

24(3)FOR A CONTRACEPTIVE DISPENSED ON AND AFTER JANUARY 1,252018, DOES NOT EXCEED A 6-MONTH SUPPLY OF THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG.

26 (D) <u>A PHARMACIST MAY NOT DISPENSE, IN A SINGLE DOSE, A QUANTITY OF</u> 27 <u>A PRESCRIPTION DRUG THAT EXCEEDS THE LIMIT PRESCRIBED BY A PRESCRIBER</u> 28 <u>WHEN THE PRESCRIBER HAS INDICATED THAT THE PRESCRIPTION BE DISPENSED</u> 29 <u>ONLY AS PRESCRIBED.</u>
