15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
17 18	Article – Public Utilities 8–207.

19 THIS SECTION APPLIES TO SERVICE THAT A TELEPHONE COMPANY 20 PROVIDES TO A RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMER.

21 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A (B) **(1)** 22 TELEPHONE COMPANY THAT PROVIDES LOCAL EXCHANGE ACCESS SERVICE USING

- 1 ITS OWN PLANT MAY NOT REPLACE A COPPER LANDLINE WITH OPTICAL FIBER CABLE OR VOICE OVER INTERNET PROTOCOL.
- 3 (2) A TELEPHONE COMPANY MAY REPLACE A COPPER LANDLINE 4 WITH AN OPTICAL FIBER CABLE OR VOICE OVER INTERNET PROTOCOL IF A 5 CUSTOMER OR A GROUP OF CUSTOMERS SUBMITS WRITTEN APPROVAL OF THE 6 REPLACEMENT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1, 2021, the Public Service Commission shall report to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Economic Matters Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on its findings and recommendations regarding:
- 11 (1) a comparison of landline telephone service provided on copper line, 12 optical fiber cable, and Voice over Internet Protocol in terms of:
- 13 (i) network reliability;
- 14 (ii) regulatory oversight; and
- 15 (iii) customer health and safety considerations; and
- 16 (2) methods for ensuring that future removal and replacement of copper landline occurs on a uniform basis across all geographic regions of the State.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of September 30, 2022, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
