18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 customary and normal veterinary and agricultural husbandry practices (1)2 including dehorning, castration, tail docking, and limit feeding; 3 research conducted in accordance with protocols approved by an animal care and use committee, as required under the federal Animal Welfare Act or the federal 4 Health Research Extension Act: 5 6 an activity that may cause unavoidable physical pain to an animal, (3)7 including food processing, pest elimination, AND animal training, [and hunting,] if the person performing the activity uses the most humane method reasonably available; [or] 8 9 **(4)** HUNTING OTHER THAN BOW HUNTING, IF THE PERSON HUNTING USES THE MOST HUMANE METHOD REASONABLY AVAILABLE; OR 10 11 (II)BOW HUNTING IN A HUMANE MANNER; OR 12 [(4)] (5) normal human activities in which the infliction of pain to an animal is purely incidental and unavoidable. 13 10-604. 14 15 (a) A person may not: 16 overdrive or overload an animal; (1) 17 (2) deprive an animal of necessary sustenance; 18 (3) inflict unnecessary suffering or pain on an animal; 19 **(4)** cause, procure, or authorize an act prohibited under item (1), (2), or (3) 20 of this subsection: or 21if the person has charge or custody of an animal, as owner or otherwise, 22 unnecessarily fail to provide the animal with nutritious food in sufficient quantity, 23necessary veterinary care, proper drink, air, space, shelter, or protection from the weather. 24A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on (b) 25conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 90 days or a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or both. 26
- 27 (2) As a condition of sentencing, the court may order a defendant convicted 28 of violating this section to participate in and pay for psychological counseling.
- 29 (3) As a condition of probation, the court may prohibit a defendant from 30 owning, possessing, or residing with an animal.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017.
