## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Adult High School Pilot Program**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing an Adult High School Pilot Program; providing for the  
4 purpose of the Program; providing that the Program is under the authority and  
5 supervision of the State Department of Education and the Department of Labor,  
6 Licensing, and Regulation; authorizing the Department, in consultation with the  
7 Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, to approve up to a certain number  
8 of pilots; establishing requirements for a pilot under the Program; requiring the  
9 Department and the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to consider  
10 certain items when considering whether to approve a certain pilot; providing that a  
11 certain pilot is not a public school for certain purposes; requiring an applicant to  
12 submit a certain plan to the Department and the Department of Labor, Licensing,  
13 and Regulation that includes certain information; requiring the Department, in  
14 consultation with the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, to approve  
15 or disapprove certain items within a certain period of time; requiring the State Board  
16 of Education to grant a certain pilot a waiver from certain regulations; prohibiting  
17 the State Board from granting a waiver of a certain assessment requirement in a  
18 certain regulation; requiring a pilot to be subject to the requirements of a certain  
19 federal law and provide certain accommodations; requiring the Department and the  
20 Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to establish qualifications for  
21 operators of pilots under the Program; providing for the minimum content of certain  
22 qualifications; requiring certain operators to adopt certain written standards;  
23 requiring certain standards to be submitted to the Department and Department of  
24 Labor, Licensing, and Regulation for approval; authorizing an operator to partner  
25 with certain entities; requiring an Advisory Board to govern a pilot; providing for the

1 membership, appointments, officers, and filling of vacancies for an Advisory Board;  
 2 authorizing the operator or the Advisory Board to apply for and accept certain  
 3 funding from certain entities; requiring an operator to conduct a certain evaluation  
 4 each year; requiring an operator, after receiving certain approval from the Advisory  
 5 Board, to submit a certain evaluation report to certain departments; requiring,  
 6 beginning on a certain date, a certain operator to submit certain information to  
 7 certain departments; requiring the Department and the Department of Labor,  
 8 Licensing, and Regulation to jointly submit to the Governor and the General  
 9 Assembly a certain report on or before a certain date; requiring the Department and  
 10 the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to send a certain written notice

10           **(A) THERE IS AN ADULT HIGH SCHOOL PILOT PROGRAM.**

11           **(B) THE GENERAL PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO ESTABLISH AN**  
12 **ALTERNATIVE METHOD FOR ADULTS WHO DID NOT GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL**  
13 **TO EARN A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA AND POTENTIALLY TO EARN POSTSECONDARY**

15                   **(2) CONSIDER GEOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY IN LOCATIONS FOR THE**  
16 **PILOTS; AND**

17                   **(3) APPROVE ONE PILOT IN A RURAL AREA FOR EACH TWO PILOTS**  
18 **APPROVED IN URBAN AREAS.**

19                   **(D) A PILOT ESTABLISHED UNDER THE PROGRAM IS NOT A PUBLIC SCHOOL**  
20 **FOR PUBLIC FINANCING PURPOSES UNDER TITLE 5 OF THIS ARTICLE.**

11 (VI) A DESCRIPTION OF ANY PROGRAMS OR PARTNERSHIPS  
12 WITH ORGANIZATIONS OR BUSINESSES FOR PROVIDING JOB SKILLS, INDUSTRY  
13 CERTIFICATIONS, OR HIGHER EDUCATION CREDITS;

14 (VII) THE WRAPAROUND SERVICES OFFERED;

15 (VIII) A DESCRIPTION OF THE ADVISORY AND COACHING  
16 SERVICES THAT PROVIDE SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS TO:

17 1. ESTABLISH CAREER PATHWAYS IN HIGH NEED AND  
18 GROWTH INDUSTRY SECTORS; AND

19 2. MAKE EFFECTIVE TRANSITIONS INTO  
20 POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION AND INDUSTRY CREDENTIALING OPPORTUNITIES;

21 (IX) THE PILOT'S GOVERNANCE PLAN; ~~AND~~

22 (X) A DETAILED BUDGET FOR THE INITIAL 3-YEAR OPERATING  
23 PERIOD THAT DEMONSTRATES THE PILOT'S FINANCIAL SELF-SUFFICIENCY; AND

24 (XI) PLANS FOR WORKING WITH ENGLISH LANGUAGE  
25 LEARNERS.

26 (B) WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE DATE OF RECEIPT OF A PLAN SUBMITTED  
27 UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION:

28 (1) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT  
29 OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION, SHALL APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE THE  
30 PILOT'S CURRICULUM; AND

1           **(2) IF THE DEPARTMENT APPROVES THE PILOT'S CURRICULUM**  
2 **UNDER ITEM (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH**  
3 **THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION, SHALL APPROVE OR**  
4 **DISAPPROVE THE APPLICANT'S PLAN AND PILOT.**

5           **(C) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION,**  
6 **WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE DATE OF APPROVAL OF THE PLAN AND PILOT UNDER**  
7 **SUBSECTION (B)(2) OF THIS SECTION AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AUTHORITY**  
8 **OF THE STATE BOARD UNDER § 2-205 OF THIS ARTICLE TO GRANT WAIVERS FROM**  
9 **REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD, THE STATE BOARD SHALL GRANT**  
10 **THE PILOT A WAIVER FROM ANY REGULATION THAT CONFLICTS WITH THE PURPOSE**  
11 **AND GOALS OF THE PILOT'S PLAN APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT, INCLUDING THE**  
12 **STUDENT SERVICE REQUIREMENT IN COMAR 13A.03.02.05.**

17           **(1) BE SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 504 OF THE**  
18 **REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973; AND**

19           **(2) SHALL PROVIDE ACCOMMODATIONS EQUAL TO THOSE A STUDENT**  
20 **WOULD QUALIFY FOR UNDER THE INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES EDUCATION**  
21 **ACT IF A STUDENT HAS A DISABILITY WITH AN EDUCATIONAL IMPACT.**

1 (III) HAVE PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE PROVIDING EDUCATION  
2 SERVICES OR WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES TO ADULT LEARNERS WHO  
3 HAVE BEEN LIMITED BY EDUCATIONAL DISADVANTAGES, A DISABILITY, A CRIMINAL  
4 RECORD, OR SIMILAR BARRIERS TO EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES; ~~AND~~

5 (IV) HAVE SECURED FINANCING TO DEVELOP OR THE  
6 CAPABILITY TO SECURE FINANCING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A PHYSICAL SITE  
7 FOR THE PILOT; AND

8 (V) HIRE APPROPRIATELY TRAINED INSTRUCTIONAL  
9 PERSONNEL.

10 (3) AN OPERATOR MAY BE A PARTNERSHIP OF TWO OR MORE  
11 PERSONS THAT MEET THE QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

12 (B) (1) THE OPERATOR SHALL ADOPT WRITTEN STANDARDS FOR THE  
13 ADMISSION AND DISMISSAL OF STUDENTS.

14 (2) THE STANDARDS AND ANY AMENDMENTS SHALL BE SUBMITTED  
15 TO THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND  
16 REGULATION FOR APPROVAL.

17 (C) THE OPERATOR MAY PARTNER WITH:

18 (1) A COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION; OR

15 TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE  
16 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY A REPORT THAT INCLUDES:

17 (1) AN EVALUATION OF EACH PILOT APPROVED UNDER THIS  
18 SUBTITLE;

19 (2) A RECOMMENDATION AS TO EXPANSION, CONTINUATION,  
20 MODIFICATIONS TO, OR TERMINATION OF THE PROGRAM;

21 (3) DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION ON STUDENT ENROLLMENT UNDER  
22 THE PROGRAM; AND

23 (4) THE FISCAL SOLVENCY OF THE PROGRAM.

25 (A) IF THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING,  
26 AND REGULATION AGREE THAT THE PROGRAM IS NOT EFFECTIVE, THE  
27 DEPARTMENT AND DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION SHALL  
28 SEND WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE PILOTS THAT THE PROGRAM HAS BEEN  
29 DISCONTINUED.

1           **(B) THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND**  
2 **REGULATION SHALL JOINTLY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM.**

3           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
4 1, 2017.
