1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Calvert County – Solid Waste Disposal Contracts**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing Calvert County to enter into a contract for solid waste
4 disposal that may include transportation, may require payment of certain funds or
5 receipt of certain payment, and is for an initial term of not more than a certain
6 number of years; making a certain stylistic change; and generally relating to
7 contracts for solid waste disposal entered into by Calvert County.

11 Article 5 – Public Local Laws of Maryland
12 (2002 Edition and May 2015 Supplement, as amended)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article 5 – Calvert County**

16 6–103.

17 **(A)** When it is advantageous to the county to do so, the county may contract to
18 purchase supplies or services for periods of more than one year if:

1 (1) Funds for the total cost of the contract are available at the time [of] the
2 contract is executed; or

3 (2) A contract requiring the payment of funds from appropriations of more
4 than one fiscal year is approved by resolution of the Commissioners, and is not for more
5 than a three-year term.

6 (B) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, THE COUNTY
7 MAY ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL THAT:

8 (1) MAY INCLUDE TRANSPORTATION;

9 (2) MAY REQUIRE PAYMENT OF FUNDS FROM APPROPRIATIONS OF
10 THE COUNTY OR RECEIPT OF PAYMENT TO THE COUNTY; AND

11 (3) IS NOT FOR MORE THAN A TWENTY-YEAR INITIAL TERM.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2017.
