Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages - Stadium Beer, Wine, and Liquor License - Beer Vendors

- FOR the purpose of repealing a certain provision of law that prohibits a stadium beer, wine,
 and liquor license holder in Harford County from allowing a roving vendor to

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

23	(a) (1)	In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

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"Concession manager" means a person that provides and supervises 1 (2) $\mathbf{2}$ under contract the comprehensive management of all food and beverage concession sales 3 on the licensed premises. 4 (3)"Licensed premises" includes the stadium facility and stadium parking $\mathbf{5}$ lots. 6 (b) There is a stadium beer, wine, and liquor license. 7 (c)The Board may issue the license for a stadium owned by the City of Aberdeen to the owner, lessee, or concession manager of a professional baseball stadium. 8 9 (d) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the license authorizes the (1)10 license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor for on-premises consumption. 11 (2)The license holder may sell, serve, or allow the consumption of beer, 12wine, and liquor on the stadium parking lots only with the prior written approval of the 13Board. Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the license holder may sell 14(e) (1)15beer, wine, and liquor on Monday through Sunday, from 8 a.m. to 2 a.m. the following day. 16 (2)During a baseball game, a holder of a stadium license may not sell beer, 17wine, or liquor: 18 (i) after the beginning of the eighth inning; or 19 during a doubleheader game, after the beginning of the sixth (ii) 20inning of the second game. 21An individual who serves beer, wine, and liquor on the licensed (f)(1)22premises shall hold a certificate from an alcohol awareness program that the Board 23approves. 24(2)An individual may serve liquor during a baseball game only on the club 25level or in a dining area where patrons are seated. 26(3)(i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, an 27individual may serve beer, wine, and liquor during a baseball game only in a plastic, 28Styrofoam, or paper container. 29An individual may serve beer, wine, and liquor in a glass (ii) 30 container on the club level or in a dining area where patrons are seated. 31(4) (i) This paragraph does not apply to beer and wine served on the club level or in a dining area where patrons are seated. 32

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1 (ii) An individual may dispense beer and wine during a baseball 2 game only from a stationary structure that is in the stadium and equipped with a motor 3 vehicle driver's license scanner.

4 (5) A license holder may not allow a roving vendor to dispense [beer,] 5 wine[,] and liquor.

6 (6) A license holder may not allow a person to carry beer, wine, and liquor 7 onto or off of the licensed premises.

8 (g) The annual license fee is \$10,000.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 10 1, 2017.
